House Bill 2396

Sponsored by Representative DEXTER, Senator DEMBROW; Representatives GAMBA, PHAM K, REYNOLDS (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Environmental Quality Commission to establish and implement indirect source review program. Directs commission to require that owner or operator of indirect source that creates or is likely to create significant air quality concern notify affected residents and businesses.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to indirect sources of air pollution; and prescribing an effective date.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2023 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 468A.
- SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section, "indirect source" and "indirect source review program" have the meanings given those terms in 42 U.S.C. 7410 (5).
- (2) The Environmental Quality Commission shall adopt rules to establish and implement an indirect source review program to control emissions of air contaminants from or associated with indirect sources of air pollution. An indirect source review program established under this section must:
- (a) Control emissions associated with the construction and operation of an indirect source; and
- (b) Control the aggregate emissions from on-road vehicles and nonroad vehicles and engines associated with the indirect source.
- (3) In addition to the program established under subsection (2) of this section, the commission shall require by rule that, if the emissions associated with an indirect source create or are likely to create a significant air quality concern, the owner or operator of the indirect source must provide notice to all of the residents and businesses in the geographic area affected by the emissions.
- SECTION 3. This 2023 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2023 regular session of the Eighty-second Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
