## A-Engrossed House Bill 2420

Ordered by the House March 30 Including House Amendments dated March 30

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Directs Oregon Health Authority to adopt rules allowing county registrar to issue and sell records of live births and deaths occurring in any county of state.]

Directs Oregon Health Authority to designate work group to propose options for equitable access to birth and death certificates throughout state and equitable fee revenue to maintain and improve vital records system.

Requires authority to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly related to vital records no later than January 1, 2025.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to vital records; and declaring an emergency.

**Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:** 

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall designate a work group comprised of

5 representatives of county vital records offices, funeral directors, other partners and com-

6 munity members to propose options for equitable access to birth and death certificates

7 throughout the state and equitable fee revenue to maintain and improve the state and county

8 vital records system.

9 (2) The authority shall report to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly re-

lated to vital records on the options proposed by the work group no later than January 1,
2025.

12 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2023 Act is repealed on January 2, 2025.

13 SECTION 3. This 2023 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2023 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
