## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Establishes Future Business Leaders Program within Department of Education.]

[Directs State Board of Education to adopt rules to administer program.]

[Creates Future Business Leaders Program Account within State Treasury for purpose of funding program.]

Directs Department of Education to distribute moneys to support career and technical student organizations.

Allows moneys from Ballot Measure 98 (2016) to be used for distributions. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

<b>5</b>	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
6	SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall distribute moneys to support career
7	and technical student organizations in providing opportunities for students in this state to
8	develop leadership, academic and career skills.
9	(2) Organizations receiving moneys as provided by this section shall be managed individ-
10	ually by their respective association leadership bodies in coordination with the department.
11	(3) The department, on behalf of the State of Oregon, may solicit and accept gifts, grants,
12	donations and other moneys from public and private sources for distribution to organizations
13	as described in subsection (1) of this section.
14	(4) Nothing in this section prevents a school district from receiving apportionments un-
15	der section 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)).
16	SECTION 2. Section 2, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)), is amended to

18	Sec. 2. The High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness Fund is established in
19	the General Fund for the purposes of improving the graduation rates and college and career read-
20	iness of all high school students in Oregon. The Legislative Assembly shall appropriate, allocate or
21	otherwise make available to the High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness Fund
22	an amount not less than \$800 per high school student per school year. The fund is continuously
23	appropriated to the Department of Education for the purposes of sections 2 to 16, [of this 2016
24	Act] chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)), and for the purposes of distribution

Section 3, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)), is amended to 3 read: 4 Sec. 3. (1)(a) Subject to sections 10 and 14, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure  $\mathbf{5}$ 98 (2016)), and after any distributions have been made to career and technical student or-6 ganizations as described in section 1 of this 2017 Act [of this 2016 Act, for school years beginning 7 on or after July 1, 2017], the High School Graduation and College and Career Readiness Fund shall 8 9 be apportioned to each school district based on the extended weighted average daily membership of high school students computed as provided in ORS 327.013 (1)(c) for the purposes described in 10 sections 2 to 16, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot Measure 98 (2016)). 11 12(b) In the event the Department of Education is unable to determine the extended weighted av-13 erage daily membership of high school students for a school district, the department may determine the average extended weighted average daily membership for all students in the school district and 14 15 apply the average extended weighted average daily membership to the number of high school students in the school district. 16

17 (2)(a) For school years beginning on or after July 1, 2018, the amount appropriated, allocated 18 or otherwise made available to the fund under section 2, chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2017 (Ballot 19 Measure 98 (2016)), [of this 2016 Act] shall be increased each school year in a biennium by the 20 amount derived from the application of the process in Executive Order 14-14 used to calculate the 21 cost to maintain the current level of service.

(b) The intent of paragraph (a) of this subsection is to apply the process in Executive Order 14-14 in the event Executive Order 14-14 is canceled, superseded or otherwise made ineffective.

24 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2017 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2017 25 regular session of the Seventy-ninth Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
