House Bill 2564

Sponsored by Representative WITT (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires contracting agency to base determination of contractor's responsibility for public improvement contract on contractor's demonstrating that contractor has provided health insurance to contractor's employees for period of two years before contractor submitted bid for public improvement contract. Specifies exemptions for certain bidders.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

 $\mathbf{5}$ SECTION 1. ORS 279C.375 is amended to read:

6 279C.375. (1) After a contracting agency has opened bids and determined that the contracting 7 agency will award a public improvement contract, the contracting agency shall award the contract 8 to the lowest responsible bidder.

9 (2) At least seven days before awarding a public improvement contract, unless the contracting 10 agency determines that seven days is impractical under rules adopted under ORS 279A.065, the 11 contracting agency shall issue to each bidder or post, electronically or otherwise, a notice of the 12contracting agency's intent to award a contract. This subsection does not apply to a contract to which competitive bidding does not apply under ORS 279C.335 (1)(c) or (d). The notice and the 13 14 manner in which the notice is posted or issued must conform to rules adopted under ORS 279A.065. 15(3) In determining the lowest responsible bidder, a contracting agency shall do all of the fol-

16 lowing:

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17 (a) Check the list created by the Construction Contractors Board under ORS 701.227 for bidders 18 who are not qualified to hold a public improvement contract.

(b) Determine whether the bidder is responsible. A responsible bidder must demonstrate to the 19 20 contracting agency that the bidder:

21(A) Has available the appropriate financial, material, equipment, facility and personnel resources 22and expertise, or has the ability to obtain the resources and expertise, necessary to meet all con-23 tractual responsibilities.

24 (B) Holds current licenses that businesses or service professionals operating in this state must 25hold in order to undertake or perform the work specified in the contract.

26 (C) Is covered by liability insurance and other insurance in amounts the contracting agency 27requires in the solicitation documents.

28(D) Qualifies as a carrier-insured employer or a self-insured employer under ORS 656.407 or has 29 elected coverage under ORS 656.128.

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(E) Has provided health insurance to the bidder's employees for a period of two years

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1 before the date on which the bidder submitted the bid for the public improvement contract.

2 The requirement set forth in this subparagraph does not apply to a bidder if the bidder em-

3 ploys 25 or fewer employees or if the bidder has existed for less than two years before sub-

4 mitting the bid for the public improvement contract.

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[(E)] (F) Has made the disclosure required under ORS 279C.370.

6 [(F)] (G) Completed previous contracts of a similar nature with a satisfactory record of per-7 formance. For purposes of this subparagraph, a satisfactory record of performance means that to the 8 extent that the costs associated with and time available to perform a previous contract remained 9 within the bidder's control, the bidder stayed within the time and budget allotted for the procure-10 ment and otherwise performed the contract in a satisfactory manner. The contracting agency shall 11 document the bidder's record of performance if the contracting agency finds under this subparagraph 12 that the bidder is not responsible.

13 [(G)] (H) Has a satisfactory record of integrity. The contracting agency in evaluating the 14 bidder's record of integrity may consider, among other things, whether the bidder has previous 15 criminal convictions for offenses related to obtaining or attempting to obtain a contract or subcon-16 tract or in connection with the bidder's performance of a contract or subcontract. The contracting 17 agency shall document the bidder's record of integrity if the contracting agency finds under this 18 subparagraph that the bidder is not responsible.

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[(H)] (I) Is legally qualified to contract with the contracting agency.

[(1)] (J) Possesses an unexpired certificate that the Oregon Department of Administrative Services issued under ORS 279A.167, if the bidder employs 50 or more full-time workers and submitted a bid for a procurement with an estimated contract price that exceeds \$500,000 in response to an advertisement or solicitation from a state contracting agency.

[(J)] (K) Supplied all necessary information in connection with the inquiry concerning responsibility. If a bidder fails to promptly supply information concerning responsibility that the contracting agency requests, the contracting agency shall determine the bidder's responsibility based on available information, or may find that the bidder is not responsible.

(c) Document the contracting agency's compliance with the requirements of paragraphs (a) and(b) of this subsection in substantially the following form:

26	(6) A contracting agency may not exclude a commercial contractor from competing for a public		
27	contract on the basis that the license issued by the Construction Contractors Board is endorsed as		
28	a level 1 or level 2 license. As used in this section, "commercial contractor" has the meaning given		
29	that term in ORS 701.005.		
30	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 279C.375 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to		
31	contracts that a contracting agency first advertises or otherwise solicits on or after the ef-		
32	fective date of this 2017 Act or, if the contracting agency does not advertise or solicit the		
33	contract, to contracts that the contracting agency first enters into on or after the effective		
34	date of this 2017 Act.		
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
