House Bill 2595

Sponsored by Representative BUCKLEY (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires Senate confirmation of appointed members of State Board of Agriculture. Prohibits board members representing public interest from having significant financial interest in production of agricultural commodities. Requires that two agricultural commodity producers serving on board be persons engaged in marketing their production primarily for consumption within state. Declares board members to be public officials for purposes of government ethics provisions.

Relating to the State Board of Agriculture; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 244.050 and

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 561.372 is amended to read:

6 561.372. (1) In order that there may be the closest correspondence between State Department

7 of Agriculture policies and programs, the public interests and the resolution of practical agricultural

8 problems of the state, there is created the State Board of Agriculture.

9 (2) The Director of Agriculture, the Dean of the College of Agricultural Sciences of Oregon 10 State University and the chairperson of the Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall serve 11 as ex officio members of the board. The director and the dean shall be nonvoting members. The di-12 rector shall act as secretary of the board. The dean may appoint a person to represent the dean on 13 the board.

(3) The Governor shall appoint nine members to the board. The members appointed to the board
must be residents of Oregon. Not more than five of the members appointed to the board may belong
to the same political party. Party affiliation shall be determined by the appropriate entry on official
election registration cards. Appointments under this subsection are subject to confirmation
by the Senate as prescribed in ORS 171.562 and 171.565.

(4) The term of each member appointed to the board is four years. A member shall continue to serve until a successor is appointed and qualifies. Before a member's term expires, the Governor shall appoint a successor. If a vacancy occurs, the Governor shall appoint a person to complete the remainder of the unexpired term.

(5) A person who serves two consecutive terms on the board is not eligible for appointment to
 another term on the board until at least one year after the expiration of the second consecutive
 term.

(6) The Governor shall appoint two board members who are not actively involved in, and do not have a significant financial interest in, the production of agricultural commodities to be representatives of the public interests. The Governor shall appoint seven board members who are actively engaged in the production of agricultural commodities, at least two of whom must be HB 2595

engaged in marketing their commodity production primarily for consumption within this 1 2 state. The Governor shall seek to ensure that the appointed board members who produce agricultural commodities reflect the diverse nature of agricultural commodity production within the state. 3 (7) Board members are public officials for purposes of ORS chapter 244. 4 $\mathbf{5}$ SECTION 2. 36	required under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.
37	(4) Within 30 days after the filing deadline for the general election, each candidate described in
38	subsection (1) of this section who was not a candidate in the preceding primary election, or who
39	was nominated for public office described in subsection (1) of this section at the preceding primary
40	election by write-in votes, shall file with the commission a statement of economic interest as re-
41	quired under ORS 244.060, 244.070 and 244.090.
42	(5) Subsections (1) to (4) of this section apply only to persons who are incumbent, elected or
43 44	appointed public officials as of April 15 and to persons who are candidates on April 15. Subsections (1) to (4) of this section also apply to persons who do not become condidates until 30 days after the

1 (6) If a statement required to be filed under this section has not been received by the commis-2 sion within five days after the date the statement is due, the commission shall notify the public of-3 ficial or candidate and give the public official or candidate not less than 15 days to comply with the 4 requirements of this section. If the public official or candidate fails to comply by the date set by the 5 commission, the commission may impose a civil penalty as provided in ORS 244.350.

SECTION 3. The amendments to ORS 561.372 by section 1 of this 2015 Act do not termi-6 nate or shorten the term of office for any member of the State Board of Agriculture ap-7 pointed before the effective date of this 2015 Act. When each board position for a member 8 9 representing the public interest first becomes vacant on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act, the Governor shall make an appointment to the position that meets the require-10 ments of ORS 561.372. The Governor shall make appointments to the first two agricultural 11 12commodity producer positions on the board becoming vacant on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act as necessary to meet the requirements of ORS 561.372. 13
