SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Establishes Task Force on Incarcerated Veterans to research, study and make recommendations regarding outreach to and assistance for incarcerated veterans.

Requires task force to report to Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2016. Sunsets December 31, 2016. Appropriates moneys to Department of Veterans' Affairs for task force. Declares emergency, effective [on passage] July 1, 2015.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Incarcerated Veterans is established, consisting of
5	eight members appointed as follows:
6	(a) The President of the Senate shall appoint two members from among members of the
7	Senate.
8	(b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint two members from among
9	members of the House of Representatives.
10	(c) The Director of Veterans' Affairs shall appoint one representative from the Depart-
11	ment of Veterans' Affairs with expertise in services and benefits for incarcerated veterans.
12	(d) The Director of the Department of Corrections shall appoint one representative from
13	the Department of Corrections with experience with incarcerated veterans.
14	(e) The Governor shall appoint two individuals who have been incarcerated veterans or
15	who have had experience with incarcerated veterans.
16	(2) The task force shall research, study and make recommendations regarding the fol-
17	lowing:
18	(a) Outreach that may be done to incarcerated veterans with information about veterans'
19	benefits and other benefit programs that provide services and resources to incarcerated
20	veterans;
21	(b) Assistance that may be available for incarcerated veterans in applying for federal and
22	state veterans' benefits and aid to which incarcerated veteran may be entitled on account
23	of the incarcerated veterans' military service;
24	(c) Assistance that may be available to incarcerated veterans in appealing any denial of
25	veterans' benefits or aid;

(d) Informational materials that may be created for incarcerated veterans; 1 2 (e) The process and recommendations for developing a comprehensive and coordinated statewide network of information and referral resources for incarcerated veterans; and 3 (f) Recommendations for how the Department of Veterans' Affairs may serve as a liaison 4 for incarcerated veterans and incarcerated veterans issues with the Department of Cor-5 rections, reentry councils, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs and others. 6 (3) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction 7 of business. 8 9 (4) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 10 of the task force. (5) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 11 12(6) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appointment to become immediately effective. 13 (7) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson 14 15 or of a majority of the members of the task force. (8) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. 16 (9) The task force shall submit a report in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may 17include recommendations for legislation, to the interim legislative committees with subject 18 matter jurisdiction of veterans' affairs no later than September 15, 2016. 19 (10) The Department of Veterans' Affairs shall provide staff support to the task force. 20(11) Members of the task force who are not members of the Legislative Assembly are not 21 22entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner and 23amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses incurred in performing functions 94 of the task force shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the Department of Veterans' 25Affairs for purposes of the task force. 2627(12) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 28to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 2930 consider necessary to perform their duties. 31 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31, 2016. SECTION 3. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-32ated to the Department of Veterans' Affairs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, out of 33 34 the General Fund, the amount of \$21,068, to implement and carry out the functions of the

35 Task Force on Incarcerated Veterans established in section 1 of this 2015 Act.

36 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 37 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect 38 on July 1, 2015.
