SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers to use smoke evacuation system during surgical procedures likely to generate surgical smoke.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to surgical smoke.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2019 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 441.015 to 5 441.063.

6 SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section:

(a) "Energy generating device" means a tool that performs a surgical function using
heat, laser, electricity or other form of energy.

9 (b) "Smoke evacuation system" means equipment that effectively captures and neutral-

izes surgical smoke at the point of origin and before the smoke makes contact with the eyes
or the respiratory tract of the occupants of a room.

12 (c) "Surgical smoke" means the by-product that results from contact with tissue by an 13 energy generating device.

(2) A hospital or ambulatory surgical center licensed in this state shall adopt policies that
require the use of a smoke evacuation system during any surgical procedure that is likely
to generate surgical smoke.

(3) The Oregon Health Authority shall ensure compliance with this section during any
on-site inspection conducted in accordance with ORS 441.025.

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
