SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires coordinated care organization drug outlets to dispense seven-day supply of prescription drug to veteran with disability, at no cost to veteran, if veteran is unable to obtain prescription drug through United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to prescription drugs for veterans.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **<u>SECTION 1.</u>** (1) As used in this section:

5 (a) "Coordinated care organization" has the meaning given that term in ORS 414.025.

6 (b) "Drug outlet" has the meaning given that term in ORS 689.005.

7 (c) "Veteran with a disability" means a veteran who has a United States Department of
8 Veterans Affairs disability rating of at least 50 percent.

9 (2) A drug outlet, registered in this state, that contracts with or is part of a coordinated 10 care organization shall dispense to a veteran with a disability a seven-day supply, at no cost,

of a prescription drug prescribed by a provider associated with a hospital or clinic of the United States Department of Veterans Affairs if the veteran is unable to obtain the prescription drug from the hospital or clinic.

(3) A drug outlet may not require a veteran to provide documentation that the veteran
 is unable to obtain the prescription drug from the hospital or clinic but shall accept as true
 the veteran's attestation.

(4) A drug outlet may limit the number of dispensings under subsection (2) of this section
 to no more than one per calendar quarter for each veteran.

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
