House Bill 2936

Sponsored by Representative MORGAN; Representatives CATE, LEVY B, SMITH DB, WRIGHT, Senators FINDLEY, HANSELL, THATCHER, WEBER (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Repeals requirement to secure firearm in specified circumstances. Repeals requirement to secure firearm prior to transfer. Repeals requirement to report loss or theft of firearm within certain time of loss or theft. Repeals requirement to directly supervise use of firearm by minor after transfer of firearm to minor.

Repeals provisions limiting possession of firearms by concealed handgun licensees in Capitol, certain airport buildings and certain school grounds. Repeals affirmative defense to charge of possessing weapon in public building for person possessing firearm in airport in accordance with federal law.

Reduces fees payable to county sheriff for issuance and renewal of concealed handgun license.

 or projectile in the barrel or cylinder.

[(1)(a)] (1) Any person who intentionally possesses a loaded or unloaded firearm or any 2627other instrument used as a dangerous weapon, while in or on a public building, shall upon conviction be guilty of a Class C felony. 2829[(b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, in a prosecution under this section for the 30 possession of a firearm within the Capitol, within the passenger terminal of a commercial service air-31 port with over one million passenger boardings per year or on school grounds subject to a policy described in ORS 166.377, if the person proves by a preponderance of the evidence that, at the time of the 32possession, the person was licensed under ORS 166.291 and 166.292 to carry a concealed handgun, 33 34 upon conviction the person is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.]

 intentionally possesses a firearm in a court facility shall surrender the firearm to a law enforcement
 officer.

(B) A weapon, other than a firearm, in a court facility may be required to surrender the weapon
to a law enforcement officer or to immediately remove it from the court facility. A person who fails
to comply with this subparagraph is guilty, upon conviction, of a Class C felony.

43 (C) A firearm in a local court facility is guilty, upon conviction, of a Class C felony if, prior to
44 the offense, the presiding judge of the local court facility entered an order prohibiting firearms in
45 the area in which the court conducts business and during the hours in which the court operates.

(A) The person can demonstrate that the person has been convicted only once of a marijuana possession offense that constituted a misdemeanor or violation under the law of the jurisdiction of the offense, and has not completed a drug diversion program for a marijuana possession offense that constituted a misdemeanor or violation under the law of the jurisdiction of the offense; or

(B) The person can demonstrate that the person has only once completed a drug diversion program for a marijuana possession offense that constituted a misdemeanor or violation under the law of the jurisdiction of the offense, and has not been convicted of a marijuana possession offense that constituted a misdemeanor or violation under the law of the jurisdiction of the offense;

(m) Is not subject to a citation issued under ORS 163.735 or an order issued under ORS 30.866,

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(n) Has not received a dishonorable discharge from the Armed Forces of the United States;

(p) Is not presently subject to an order under ORS 426.133 prohibiting the person from pur chasing or possessing a firearm.

(2) A person who has been granted relief under ORS 166.273, 166.274 or 166.293 or 18 U.S.C.
925(c) or has had the person's record expunged under the laws of this state or equivalent laws of other jurisdictions is not subject to the disabilities in subsection (1)(g) to (L) of this section.

41 (3) Before the sheriff may issue a license:

(a) The application must state the applicant's legal name, current address and telephone number,
date and place of birth, hair and eye color and height and weight. The application must also list the
applicant's residence address or addresses for the previous three years. The application must contain
a statement by the applicant that the applicant meets the requirements of subsection (1) of this

section. The application may include the Social Security number of the applicant if the applicant
 voluntarily provides this number. The application must be signed by the applicant.

(b) The applicant must submit to fingerprinting and photographing by the sheriff. The sheriff 3 shall fingerprint and photograph the applicant and shall conduct any investigation necessary to 4 corroborate the requirements listed under subsection (1) of this section. If a nationwide criminal 5 records check is necessary, the sheriff shall request the Department of State Police to conduct the 6 check, including fingerprint identification, through the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The Federal 7 8 Bureau of Investigation shall return the fingerprint cards used to conduct the criminal records 9 check and may not keep any record of the fingerprints. The Department of State Police shall report the results of the fingerprint-based criminal records check to the sheriff. The Department of State 10 Police shall also furnish the sheriff with any information about the applicant that the Department 11 12 of State Police may have in its possession including, but not limited to, manual or computerized 13 criminal offender information.

(4) Application forms for concealed handgun licenses shall be supplied by the sheriff upon re quest. The forms shall be uniform throughout this state in substantially the following form:

I am not subject to a citation issued under ORS 163.735 or an order is-42sued under ORS 30.866, 107.700 to 107.735 or 163.738. I have never received a dishonorable discharge from the Armed Forces of the United States. I am not required to register as a sex offender in any 43 state. I understand I will be fingerprinted and photographed. 44
