## House Bill 3076

Sponsored by Representative HACK

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Requires members on school athletic teams to receive annual training to learn how to recognize symptoms of concussion and how to seek proper medical treatment.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to concussion training; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 336.485.

## 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. ORS 336.485 is amended to read: 4

336.485. (1) As used in this section: 5

6 (a) "Coach" means a person who instructs or trains members on a school athletic team, as 7 identified by criteria established by the State Board of Education by rule.

8 (b) "Health care professional" means a medical doctor, osteopathic physician, psychologist, physician assistant or nurse practitioner licensed or certified under the laws of this state. 9

(c) "Student on a public school athletic team" means a person who participates on a 10 public school athletic team, as identified by criteria established by the board by rule. 11

12 (2)(a) Each school district shall ensure that each student on a public school athletic team receives annual training to learn how to recognize the symptoms of a concussion and how 13to seek proper medical treatment when the student or another person is suspected of having 14 15a concussion.

(b) The board shall establish by rule:

17 (A) The requirements of the training described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, which shall be provided by using free resources or community resources to the extent practicable; 18 19 and

(B) Timelines to ensure that, to the extent practicable, a student on a public school 20 athletic team receives the training described in paragraph (a) of this subsection before the 2122beginning of the season for the school athletic team. A student may not be required to re-23ceive training more than once during a school year.

[(2)(a)] (3)(a) Each school district shall ensure that coaches receive annual training to learn how 25to recognize the symptoms of a concussion and how to seek proper medical treatment for a person 26 suspected of having a concussion.

27(b) The board shall establish by rule:

28 (A) The requirements of the training described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, which shall be provided by using community resources to the extent practicable; and 29

(B) Timelines to ensure that, to the extent practicable, every coach receives the training de-30 scribed in paragraph (a) of this subsection before the beginning of the season for the school athletic 31

1 team.

2 [(3)] (4) Except as provided in subsection [(4)] (5) of this section:

3 (a) A coach may not allow a member of a school athletic team to participate in any athletic event or training on the same day that the member: 4

(A) Exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion following an observed  $\mathbf{5}$ or suspected blow to the head or body; or 6

(B) Has been diagnosed with a concussion. 7

(b) A coach may allow a member of a school athletic team who is prohibited from participating 8 9 in an athletic event or training, as described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, to participate in an athletic event or training no sooner than the day after the member experienced a blow to the 10 head or body and only after the member: 11

(A) No longer exhibits signs, symptoms or behaviors consistent with a concussion; and

(B) Receives a medical release form from a health care professional. 13

[(4)] (5) A coach may allow a member of a school athletic team to participate in any athletic 14 15event or training at any time after an athletic trainer registered by the Board of Athletic Trainers 16 determines that the member has not suffered a concussion. The athletic trainer may, but is not required to, consult with a health care professional in making the determination that the member 17 18 has not suffered a concussion.

19 SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 336.485 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to students on a public school athletic team for which the season begins on or after January 1, 20212018.
