## House Bill 3089

Sponsored by Representative CLEM (at the request of Patrick Spencer)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Prohibits persons engaged in bottling wine for commercial purposes from using single-use plastic wine closures to seal wine bottles. Allows Oregon Liquor Control Commission to impose civil penalty of not more than \$250 per day of violation.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to single-use plastic wine closures.
  - Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
    - **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**
    - (a) "Single-use plastic wine closure" means a synthetic cork or any other closure, of which a majority is composed of plastic that is derived from petroleum or from a biologically based polymer such as corn, sugarcane or another plant source, and that is intended:
      - (A) To seal a bottle that contains wine;
      - (B) For use with a single bottle; and
    - (C) For disposal after use with a single bottle.
      - (b) "Wine" has the meaning given that term in ORS 471.001.
    - (2) A person engaged in bottling wine for commercial purposes may not use a single-use plastic wine closure to seal a bottle that contains wine.
    - <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The Oregon Liquor Control Commission may impose a civil penalty not to exceed \$250 for a violation of section 1 of this 2019 Act. Each day of violation constitutes a separate offense.
    - (2) Civil penalties described in this section shall be imposed in the manner provided in ORS 183.745.
    - (3) All penalties recovered under this section shall be paid into the State Treasury and credited to the General Fund and are available for general governmental expenses.
