House Bill 3491

Sponsored by Representative CLEM

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Establishes Task Force on Pesticide Use Notification. Sunsets December 31, 2016. Declares an emergency, effective on passage.

1 A BILL FOR AN ACT Relating to pesticides; and declaring an emergency. 2 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 3 SECTION 1. (1) The Task Force on Pesticide Use Notification is established, consisting 4 of nine members appointed as follows: $\mathbf{5}$ (a) The President of the Senate shall appoint four members from among members of the 6 Senate. 7 (b) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint five members from among 8 members of the House of Representatives. 9 (2) The task force shall assess the need for legislation relating to public notice of pesti-10 cide use and enforcement of trespass on land scheduled for pesticide use. 11 12 (3) The task force may consult with state agencies and members of the public as needed to fulfill the duties described in this section. 13(4) A majority of the members of the task force constitutes a quorum for the transaction 14 of business. 15 16 (5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority of the members 17of the task force. (6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. 18 19 (7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall make an appoint-20 ment to become immediately effective. 21(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call of the chairperson or of a majority of the members of the task force. 22 23(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the task force. (10) The task force may presession file legislation in the manner provided in ORS 171.130 24for interim committees. All legislation recommended by official action of the task force must 25 indicate that it is introduced at the request of the task force. 26 (11) The task force shall report to the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided in 27 ORS 192.245 at any time within 30 days after its final meeting or at such later time as the 28 President and Speaker may designate. 29 (12) The Legislative Administrator may employ persons necessary for the performance 30 of the functions of the task force. The Legislative Administrator shall fix the duties and 31

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1 amounts of compensation of these employees. The task force shall use the services of con-

2 tinuing legislative staff, without employing additional persons, to the greatest extent practi-

3 cable.

4 (13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are directed to assist 5 the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the extent permitted by laws relating 6 to confidentiality, to furnish such information and advice as the members of the task force 7 consider necessary to perform their duties.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2015 Act is repealed on December 31, 2016.

9 SECTION 3. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect
on its passage.

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
