SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Designates portion of U.S. Highway 26 within Warm Springs Reservation as Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway.

[Directs Oregon Health Authority to discount fee for registry identification card that is related to medical use of marijuana and issued to veteran who has 100 percent disability rating.] Directs Oregon State Lottery Commission to establish lottery game to benefit veterans'

education and economic development.

Directs Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development to establish program to provide or facilitate education, training and economic opportunities that benefit veterans. Establishes Veterans' Lottery Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for purposes of program. Allocates revenues from veteran-related lottery game to Veterans' Lottery Fund.

Permits private, nonpublic employer to give preference in hiring and promotion of employees to members of uniformed service, uniformed service veterans, spouses of perma-nently and totally disabled uniformed service veterans and widows and widowers of uniformed service veterans.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to veterans; appropriating money; and declaring an emergency. 2

3 Whereas the Warm Springs Reservation was founded by the Treaty with the Tribes of Middle Oregon, 12 Stat. 963 (1855); and 4

Whereas the sovereign tribes and bands, now recognized as the Confederated Tribes of the 5 Warm Springs Reservation of Oregon, have continued to operate, governing under a constitutional 6

7 form of government; and

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Whereas veterans who are members of the Confederated Tribes have served the United States 8 of America with distinction and honor and have made willing sacrifices during our nation's wars, 9 conflicts and national security missions dating to the Early Indian Wars of Oregon; and 10

Whereas the State of Oregon has honored veterans, including veterans of foreign wars, with 11

honorific signs on U.S. Highway 97, Interstate 84, Interstate 205, State Highway 126 and State 12

Highway 62 as a tribute to all of the men and women who have answered our nation's call to mili-13 tary service; and 14

Whereas the State of Oregon has not designated any highway in Oregon to honor the unique 15 history and heritage of veterans of the Confederated Tribes since the founding of the Warm Springs 16 17Reservation; and

18 Whereas an approximately 35-mile section of U.S. Highway 26, which traverses the Warm 19 Springs Reservation, lies within a right of way granted by the United States in accordance with 25

1 U.S.C. 311 and is not named for or designated to honor any veteran; and

2 Whereas an honorary designation of the portion of U.S. Highway 26 that traverses the Warm 3 Springs Reservation does not require a change in the name or designation of the highway; and

4 Whereas The Museum at Warm Springs on U.S. Highway 26 contains memorials and displays 5 commemorating a call to serve our nation in the defense of peace, freedom and vital national in-6 terests by veterans who are members of the Confederated Tribes; and

7 Whereas 499 veterans who are members of the Confederated Tribes are listed as having an-8 swered our nation's call to duty and served with honor, dedication and selfless conviction, and some 9 of those veterans made the supreme sacrifice, giving their lives in defense of our nation during the 10 following eras of armed hostilities and related missions:

11 Early Indian Wars of Oregon (Modoc and Snake Indian Wars) - 97;

- 12 World War I 14;
- 13 World War II 114;
- 14 Korean War 97;

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15 Vietnam War - 107;

16 Global War on Terrorism - 70; and

Whereas Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 4217 in Warm Springs is named in honor of Elliott
Palmer, an Army veteran killed during World War II; and

Whereas American Legion Post 48 is named in honor of Eugene A. "Cougar" Greene Sr., a distinguished recipient of the Army Silver Star, which he earned in the Korean War for conspicuous courage under enemy fire; and

22 Whereas designation of U.S. Highway 26 as the Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway will 23 preserve and foster a sense of patriotism and honor the enduring warrior spirit for all tribal veter-24 ans and their families, tribal members, all military veterans and highway travelers; and

Whereas the Warm Springs community and veterans have offered to pay for the design, fabrication, installation and maintenance of signs meeting standards of the Department of Transportation without cost to taxpayers or the State of Oregon; now, therefore,

28 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

29 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The portion of U.S. Highway 26 within the Warm Springs Reservation
 30 shall be known as the Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway.

(2) The Department of Transportation shall place and maintain suitable markers along
 the highway described in this section that indicate the designation of the highway as the
 Warm Springs Veterans Memorial Highway.

(3)(a) The department may accept moneys from, and may enter into agreements with,
 veterans groups to create, install and maintain the markers.

(b) The department may not use public funds for the installation and maintenance of the
 markers.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 3 of this 2014 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 461.

39 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) The Oregon State Lottery Commission shall establish a lottery raffle
 40 game:

(a) That has a veteran-oriented theme or indicates that the proceeds benefit veterans'
 education and economic development related to veterans; and

(b) For which the limited sales period for tickets may include Veterans Day.

44 (2) The commission shall separately record and account for the costs and net proceeds
 45 of the lottery raffle game described in this section.

1 (3) When transferring net proceeds from the Oregon State Lottery Fund established in 2 ORS 461.530 for deposit in the Administrative Services Economic Development Fund estab-3 lished in ORS 461.540, the commission shall certify to the Joint Committee on Ways and 4 Means established under ORS 171.555 the amount of the transfer that represents the net 5 proceeds of the lottery raffle game described in this section.

6 (4) The Legislative Assembly shall allocate from the Administrative Services Economic
7 Development Fund an amount equal to the net proceeds of the lottery raffle game described
8 in this section for transfer to the Veterans' Lottery Fund established in section 4 of this 2014
9 Act to benefit veterans' education and economic development related to veterans.

10 <u>SECTION 4.</u> The Veterans' Lottery Fund is established in the State Treasury, separate 11 and distinct from the General Fund. Earnings on moneys in the Veterans' Lottery Fund 12 must be credited to the fund. All moneys in the fund are continuously appropriated to the 13 Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development for the purposes described 14 in section 5 of this 2014 Act.

15 <u>SECTION 5.</u> The Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development by rule 16 shall establish a program to provide opportunities for, or facilitate, the education and train-17 ing of veterans, the creation of jobs for veterans and economic development opportunities 18 that benefit veterans.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> The Oregon State Lottery Commission shall begin the sale of tickets for the
 lottery raffle game described in section 3 of this 2014 Act on or before July 1, 2015.

21 <u>SECTION 7.</u> (1) As used in this section, "service" and "uniformed service" have the 22 meanings given those terms in ORS 659A.082.

(2) A private, nonpublic employer may give preference in the hiring and promotion of
 employees to:

25 (a) A person who is performing, or has performed, service in the uniformed service;

(b) If a person has performed service in the uniformed service and has been determined
by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to be permanently and totally disabled
as the result of enemy action or a service-related accident, the spouse of the person; and

29 (c) The widow or widower of a person who performed service in the uniformed service.

30 <u>SECTION 8.</u> This 2014 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 31 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2014 Act takes effect 32 on its passage.

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
