SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs Department of Education to make grants to improve student achievement in certain schools that are high poverty and low performing.

Appropriates moneys to department from General Fund for purpose of making grants. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

Relating to additional support to low-performing Title I schools; appropriating money; and declaring

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The Department of Education shall make grants to improve student 6 achievement in schools that:

7 (a) Are considered high poverty under Title I of the federal Elementary and Secondary
8 Education Act of 1965;

9 (b) The department had not identified prior to January 1, 2014, as focus or priority 10 schools pursuant to a flexibility waiver submitted to the United States Department of Edu-11 cation; and

12 (c) The Department of Education has identified as needing additional supports and 13 interventions pursuant to a flexibility waiver submitted to the United States Department of 14 Education, based on:

(A) Criteria used by the Department of Education to measure the performance of the
 schools; and

17 (B) The schools' performance ranking compared to similar schools.

(2) The department shall identify schools to receive grants as provided in this section and shall notify the identified schools of the schools' eligibility to receive grants as provided in this section.

(3) Moneys received by a school under this section must be used to provide instructional
 time during a summer program.

(4) The State Board of Education may adopt any rules necessary for the administration
 of this section.

25 <u>SECTION 2.</u> In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there is appropri-26 ated to the Department of Education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, out of the 27 General Fund, the amount of \$660,000, which may be expended for the grant program estab-28 lished by section 1 of this 2014 Act.
