4 **“SECTION 5.** For purposes of Article XI-G, section 1, of the Oregon Constitution, the
5 Legislative Assembly determines that the projects authorized to be financed pursuant to
6 section 1 (1) of this 2019 Act with bonds issued under Article XI-G of the Oregon Constitution
7 will benefit higher education institutions or activities or community colleges authorized by
8 law to receive state aid.

9 **“SECTION 6.** Bonds authorized under section 1 (1) of this 2019 Act may not be issued
10 until the constructing authority certifies that the constructing authority has matching funds
11 available for the same or similar purposes as the Article XI-G bonds that will fund the grant
12 to the constructing authority, that the match funds are not proceeds of indebtedness in-
13 curred by the state under any other article of the Oregon Constitution, and that the match
14 funds are available to the constructing authority in an amount at least equal to the amount
15 of indebtedness incurred by the state through the issuance of the Article XI-G bonds.

16 **“SECTION 7.** Of the proceeds from the lottery revenue bonds authorized under section
17 2 of this 2019 Act, \$6,500,000 may be used to provide the required matching funds in relation
18 to the Article XI-G bonds authorized under section 1 (1)(a) of this 2019 Act.

19 **“SECTION 8.** (1) Out of the amount specified in section 1 (5)(m)(A) of this 2019 Act, the
20 State Treasurer may issue Article XI-Q bonds in an amount not to exceed \$31,500,000 of net
21 proceeds for the purposes and in the manner specified in section 8, chapter 705, Oregon Laws
22 2013, plus an amount estimated by the State Treasurer to pay estimated bond-related costs.

23 **“(2)** Out of the amount specified in section 1 (5)(m)(B) of this 2019 Act, the State Treas-
24 urer may issue Article XI-Q bonds in an amount not to exceed \$87,600,000 of net proceeds for
25 the purposes and in the manner specified in section 8, chapter 705, Oregon Laws 2013, plus
26 an amount estimated by the State Treasurer to pay estimated bond-related costs.

27 **“(3)** Out of the amount specified in section 1 (5)(m)(C) of this 2019 Act, the State Treas-
28 urer may issue Article XI-Q bonds in an amount not to exceed \$15,900,000 of net proceeds for
29 the purposes and in the manner specified in section 8, chapter 705, Oregon Laws 2013, plus
30 an amount estimated by the State Treasurer to pay estimated bond-related costs.

31 **“(4)** For purposes of sections 8 and 9, chapter 705, Oregon Laws 2013, and section 64,
32 chapter 723, Oregon Laws 2013, bonds issued pursuant to this section are considered to be
33 bonds issued pursuant to section 8, chapter 705, Oregon Laws 2013.

34 **“(5)** Bonds may not be issued pursuant to section 1 (5)(m)(A), (B) or (C) of this 2019 Act
35 except as provided in this section.

36 **“SECTION 9.** Section 1, chapter 570, Oregon Laws 2017, as amended by section 1, chapter 87,
37 Oregon Laws 2018, and section 7, chapter 30, Oregon Laws 2019 (Enrolled Senate Bill 5542), is
38 amended to read:

39 **“Sec. 1.** The amounts authorized, as provided by ORS 286A.035, for issuance of general obli-
40 gation bonds of the state during the 2017-2019 biennium, notwithstanding section 10, chapter 705,
41 Oregon Laws 2013, are as follows:

29 **“SECTION 10. This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
30 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect**
31 **on its passage.”.**
