# A-Engrossed House Bill 5202

Ordered by the House March 7 Including House Amendments dated March 7

Sponsored by JOINT COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

#### SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure. The statement includes a measure digest written in compliance with applicable readability standards.

Digest: The Act creates and changes limits on amounts that agencies can spend for building projects. The Act allows more time for certain projects. (Flesch Readability Score: 73.7).

[Digest: The Act changes limits on the amounts that agencies may spend for building projects. (Flesch Readability Score: 65.7).]

Establishes and modifies the limits on payment of expenses from specified funds by certain state agencies for capital construction.

Extends the expiration dates of certain capital construction project approvals and expenditure limitations.

Declares an emergency, effective on passage.
