House Joint Resolution 24

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON RULES

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to allow bills that raise revenue and that have sole effect of reversing policy that, at enactment, required only simple majority of all members elected to each house, to pass with simple majority of both houses.

Refers proposed amendment to people for their approval or rejection at next regular general election.

JOINT RESOLUTION 1 Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon: 2 PARAGRAPH 1. Section 25, Article IV of the Constitution of the State of Oregon, is amended 3 to read: Sec. 25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2) of this section, a majority of all the 5 members elected to each [House] house shall be necessary to pass every bill or [Joint] joint resol-6 ution. 8 (2) Three-fifths of all members elected to each [House] house shall be necessary to pass bills for raising revenue, other than bills that have a sole effect of reversing a policy that, at 9 10 enactment, required only a simple majority of all members elected to each house, which shall require only a simple majority of all members elected to each house. 11 12 (3) All bills, and [Joint] joint resolutions passed, shall be signed by the presiding officers of the 13 respective houses. 14 PARAGRAPH 2. The amendment proposed by this resolution shall be submitted to the 15 people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout 16 this state. 17
