SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Establishes Oregon Liquor Control Commission Modernization Task Force. Requires task force to undertake evaluation of existing system for distributing and selling distilled liquor and identify and evaluate potential means for modernizing system. Requires task force to report to interim committee of Legislative Assembly no later than October 1, 2014.]
[Removes] Limits inclusion of Oregon Liquor Control Commission [from] in definition of

[Removes] **Limits inclusion of** Oregon Liquor Control Commission [from] **in** definition of "criminal justice agency" for purposes of certain statutes dealing with fingerprinting, criminal background checks, agency information and data sharing and other matters. [Adds liquor enforcement inspectors to definition of criminal justice agency.]

Declares emergency, effective on passage.
