Senate Bill 158

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop and implement pilot program to assist foster youth transitioning from community colleges to public universities. Establishes criteria for pilot program.

Authorizes issuance of lottery bonds to finance programs developed under pilot program to assist foster youth transitioning from community colleges to public universities. Creates Foster Youth Promise Support Program Fund. Continuously appropriates moneys in fund to commission. Directs commission to use moneys in fund to finance programs developed under pilot program to assist foster youth transitioning from community colleges to public universities.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

- 2 Relating to support programs for students receiving foster youth tuition waiver; and declaring an 3 emergency.

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Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4

SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "Foster Youth Promise student" means a student

enrolled in a community college or a public university listed in ORS 352.002 who is entitled 6 to a waiver of all tuition and fees under ORS 350.300. 7

8 (2) The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall develop and implement a pilot

9 program to assist Foster Youth Promise students transitioning from community colleges to

- 10 public universities.
- (3) The pilot program must: 11

12 (a) Be implemented in each community college and public university that has existing support programs for Foster Youth Promise students; and 13

(b) Develop and implement additional support programs for Foster Youth Promise stu-14 15dents, including but not limited to:

(A) Facilitating public university orientations tailored to Foster Youth Promise students;

(B) Developing mentorship programs for Foster Youth Promise students following 17matriculation into a public university; 18

(C) Encouraging faculty at public universities to identify opportunities for Foster Youth 19 20 Promise students to assist with research and other special projects; and

21(D) Developing other types of programs and strategies to assist Foster Youth Promise 22 students.

23(4) The commission shall:

24 (a) Analyze the existing support programs offered to Foster Youth Promise students by community colleges and public universities; 25

26 (b) Coordinate alignment of the existing support programs offered to Foster Youth

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1 Promise students between community colleges and public universities; and

2 (c) Coordinate private fund-raising efforts to provide Foster Youth Promise students with 3 additional financial support.

- 4 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The Higher Education Coordinating Commission shall report on the efficacy 5 of the pilot program established under section 1 of this 2019 Act, in the manner provided in 6 ORS 192.245, to the committees of the Legislative Assembly related to higher education at 7 least once during each of five consecutive regular sessions of the Legislative Assembly, be-8 ginning with the 2020 regular session of the Legislative Assembly.
- 9 <u>SECTION 3.</u> (1) As used in this section and section 4 of this 2019 Act, "Foster Youth
 10 Promise student" has the meaning given that term in section 1 of this 2019 Act.
- (2) The Legislative Assembly finds that assisting Foster Youth Promise students who
 intend to transition from community colleges to public universities as part of the pilot pro gram established under section 1 of this 2019 Act will:
- 14 (a) Help Foster Youth Promise students succeed in their educational endeavors;
- (b) Positively impact the educational and career prospects of both current and future
 Foster Youth Promise students; and
- (c) Strengthen the efficacy of the tuition waiver provided to current and former foster
 youth under ORS 350.300.
- (3) The factors described in subsection (2) of this section will encourage and promote
 economic development within the State of Oregon, and issuance of lottery bonds to finance
 the pilot program is therefore an appropriate use of state lottery funds under Article XV,
 section 4, of the Oregon Constitution, and ORS 461.510.
- (4) At the request of the Higher Education Coordinating Commission, the State Treasurer
 is authorized to issue lottery bonds pursuant to ORS 286A.560 to 286A.585, for the biennium
 beginning July 1, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$_____ million, for the purpose described
 in subsection (5) of this section, plus an additional amount to be estimated by the State
 Treasurer for payment of bond-related costs incurred by the commission and the State
 Treasurer.
- (5) Net proceeds of lottery bonds issued pursuant to this section must be deposited in the
 Foster Youth Promise Support Program Fund established under section 4 of this 2019 Act in
 an amount sufficient to provide \$_____ million in net proceeds and interest earnings for disbursement to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to fund programs to assist
 Foster Youth Promise students transitioning from community colleges to public universities
 as part of the pilot program established under section 1 of this 2019 Act.
- (6) Bond-related costs incurred by the Higher Education Coordinating Commission and
 the State Treasurer for the lottery bonds authorized by this section must be paid from the
 gross proceeds of the lottery bonds and from allocations for the purposes of ORS 286A.576
 (1)(c).
- 39 <u>SECTION 4.</u> (1) The Foster Youth Promise Support Program Fund is established, sepa-40 rate and distinct from the General Fund. The moneys in the Foster Youth Promise Support 41 Program Fund and the interest earnings on moneys in the fund are continuously appropri-42 ated to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for the purposes described in sub-43 section (2) of this section. The fund consists of moneys deposited in the fund under section 44 3 of this 2019 Act and may include other fees, revenues or other income transferred into the 45 fund by the Legislative Assembly for payment of costs incurred to establish the Foster Youth

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1 Promise Support Program Fund.

2 (2) Moneys in the fund are available for immediate distribution to the Higher Education 3 Coordinating Commission to:

4 (a) Pay the costs incurred to fund programs to assist Foster Youth Promise students 5 transitioning from community colleges to public universities as part of the pilot program 6 established under section 1 of this 2019 Act.

7 (b) Pay bond-related costs, as defined in ORS 286A.560.

- 8 <u>SECTION 5.</u> This 2019 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 9 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2019 Act takes effect
- 10 on its passage.
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
