Senate Bill 337

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Requires State Forestry Department, State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation to enter into interagency agreement allowing use of State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation personnel to provide staffing assistance to State Forestry Department during fire season.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the provision of staffing assistance to the State Forestry Department.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> (1) The State Forestry Department, the State Department of Fish and 5 Wildlife and the Department of Transportation shall enter into interagency agreements to 6 allow the use of State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation 7 personnel to provide staffing assistance to the State Forestry Department as needed during 8 any period in which the State Forester has declared a fire season for all or part of one or 9 more forest protection districts. 10 (2) An interagency agreement described in this section may include provisions for the

training of State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Transportation employees in the performance of State Forestry Department staff duties, functions and procedures. The State Department of Fish and Wildlife and the Department of Transportation shall bill the State Forestry Department for the reasonable costs of employee time expended for training to perform State Forestry Department staff duties, functions and procedures and any employee time spent providing staffing assistance to the State Forestry Department under an interagency agreement.

(3) Any expenditure of time for training in State Forestry Department duties, functions
and procedures under this section and any provision of staffing assistance under an agree ment described in this section must be in conformance with the terms of any applicable
collective bargaining agreements and state personnel rules.
