## Senate Bill 390

Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Directs Public Utility Commission, in coordination with State Department of Energy, to study and develop proposal for modifying Oregon laws as necessary to require 100 percent of electricity sold to retail electricity consumers to be electricity generated utilizing renewable and carbon-free energy. Directs commission to provide results to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

Sunsets January 2, 2023.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT 1 2 Relating to clean energy; and prescribing an effective date. 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. (1) The Public Utility Commission, in coordination with the State Depart-4 ment of Energy, shall study and develop a proposal for modifying Oregon laws as necessary 5 to require that 100 percent of the electricity sold to retail electricity consumers be electricity generated utilizing renewable and carbon-free energy. 7 (2) The commission shall provide the results of the study and the proposal in a report to 8 the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly in the manner provided by 10 ORS 192.245 no later than September 15, 2022. SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2021 Act is repealed on January 2, 2023. 12 SECTION 3. This 2021 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2021 regular session of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die. 13

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
