82nd OREGON LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY--2023 Regular Session

Senate Bill 516

Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW, Representative NERON, Senators SOLLMAN, WEBER; Representative WRIGHT (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Oregon State University Extension Service to collaborate with Department of Education for purpose of identifying and collecting student data relevant for maintenance of outdoor school programs.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to outdoor school programs; amending ORS 327.390.

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 327.390 is amended to read:

5 327.390. (1) The Oregon State University Extension Service shall assist school districts and ed-

6 ucation service districts in providing outdoor school programs. The Oregon State University Exten-

sion Service shall provide assistance by administering a grant program, providing program
leadership and providing program maintenance.

- 9 (2) Grants shall be awarded for outdoor school programs that:
- 10 (a) Provide a six-day, residential, hands-on educational experience, or an equivalent outdoor ed-
- 11 ucational experience that reflects local community needs and contexts, featuring field study oppor-

12 tunities for students learning about:

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13 (A) Soil, water, plants and animals;

14 (B) The role of timber, agriculture and other natural resources in the economy of this state;

15 (C) The interrelationship of nature, natural resources, economic development and career oppor-16 tunities in this state; and

17 (D) The importance of this state's environment and natural resources.

(b) Are integrated with local school curricula in a manner that assists students in meeting state
 standards related to science, technology, engineering and mathematics, and international standards
 related to science.

(c) Provide students with opportunities to develop leadership, critical thinking and decision-making skills.

(d) Address the inequity of outdoor educational opportunities for underserved children in thisstate.

(e) Provide students with opportunities to learn about the interdependence of urban and ruralareas.

27 (3) Grants shall be awarded to a school district or to an education service district.

28 (4) Priority for grants shall be given to outdoor school programs that promote:

29 (a) Higher scores on standardized measures of academic achievement in reading, writing, math,

30 science and social studies.

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(b) Greater self-sufficiency and leadership skills. 1 2 (c) Fewer discipline and classroom management problems. (d) Increased student engagement and pride in accomplishments. 3 (e) Greater proficiency in solving problems and thinking strategically. 4 (f) Better application of systems thinking and increased ability to think creatively. 5 (g) Improved communication skills and enhanced ability to work in group settings. 6 (h) Greater enthusiasm for language arts, math, science and social studies. 7 (i) Increased knowledge and understanding of science content, concepts and processes. 8 g (j) Better ability to apply science and civic processes to real-world situations. (k) Improved understanding of mathematical concepts and mastery of math skills. 10 11 (L) Improved language arts skills. 12 (m) Better comprehension of social studies content. 13 (n) Accessibility to students of all abilities and learning styles. (5)(a) The Director of the Oregon State University Extension Service shall convene an advisory 14 15 committee for the purpose of administering the grant program established under this section. When selecting the members of the committee, the director shall take into consideration geographic and 16 demographic diversity and shall ensure that the committee has representatives of the environmental 17 18 community, the natural resources community and fifth-grade or sixth-grade education. 19 (b) The advisory committee shall recommend to the director: 20 (A) Standards for outdoor school programs; and 21(B) Distributions of moneys for outdoor school programs. 22(6) The Oregon State University Extension Service shall provide program leadership of outdoor 23school programs, including: (a) Providing program management and administration, including: 94 (A) Developing and reviewing outdoor school program curricula; 25(B) Designing outdoor school program lessons that are available on websites and mobile devices; 2627(C) Developing outdoor school program learning modules and materials; (D) Implementing the outdoor school program; 28(E) Developing best practices for providing outdoor school programs; and 2930 (F) Providing staff training related to outdoor school programs; 31 (b) Convening an advisory committee to assist with management activities; 32(c) Distributing grants and entering into contracts and other agreements related to financing; (d) Providing procurement services; 33 34 (e) Complying with reporting requirements; and (f) Ensuring compliance with program requirements. 35 (7)(a) The Oregon State University Extension Service shall provide program maintenance, in-36 37 cluding: 38 $[(\alpha)]$ (A) Conducting program reviews and implementing program revisions; [(b)] (B) Making quality assessments and monitoring the program for quality; 39 [(c)] (C) Evaluating outputs and impacts of outdoor school programs; 40 [(d)] (D) Engaging in camp development, including the selection, management and coordination 41 of camps; and 42 43 [(e)] (E) Conducting risk management. (b) The Oregon State University Extension Service shall collaborate with the Department 44

45 of Education to identify and collect student data that is relevant for the purpose of program

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1 maintenance, as described in paragraph (a) of this subsection.

2 (8) Nothing in this section shall be construed as imposing on the Oregon State University Ex-

3 tension Service any duties or obligations unless funding is provided to the service for expenses in-

4 curred by the service for the purposes of this section.

5 (9) The director shall submit an annual report to:

6 (a) The Department of Education, related to the ability of outdoor school programs to assist

- 7 students in meeting state standards related to science, technology, engineering and mathematics,
- 8 and international standards related to science; and

9 (b) The interim legislative committees on education, related to grant programs.

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
