Makes offense of smoking in motor vehicle primary offense.

2	Relating to offenses committed in a motor vehicle when a person under 18 years of age is in the
3	motor vehicle; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 811.193.
4	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
5	SECTION 1. ORS 811.193 is amended to read:
6	811.193. (1)(a) A person commits the offense of smoking in a motor vehicle if the person smokes
7	in a motor vehicle while a person under 18 years of age is in the motor vehicle.
8	(b) As used in this subsection, "smokes" means to inhale[,] or exhale[,] a substance contained
9	in, or to burn or carry, a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe, [weed, plant,] or other product or device
10	used to smoke tobacco, marijuana, a regulated narcotic or other combustible substance.
11	[(2) Notwithstanding ORS 810.410, a police officer may enforce this section only if the police officer
12	has already stopped and detained the driver operating the motor vehicle for a separate traffic violation
13	or other offense.]
14	[(3)] (2) Smoking in a motor vehicle is a:
15	(a) Class D traffic violation for a first offense.
16	(b) Class C traffic violation for a second or subsequent offense.
17	SECTION 2. The amendments to ORS 811.193 by section 1 of this 2015 Act apply to of
18	fenses committed on or after the effective date of this 2015 Act.
