AN ACT

Relating to the financial administration of the Department of Justice; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> There are appropriated to the Department of Justice, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, out of the General Fund, the following amounts, for the following purposes:
