## AN ACT

Relating to recognition for fallen military service members.

Whereas Oregon and the nation should honor the service of American veterans who have given their lives in the various wars in defense of freedom; and

Whereas we live in the 21st century and it is time for a 21st century policy in all 50 states; and Whereas the highest salute our nation can bestow on our military or public officials, including the President of the United States, is formally known as the "21 Gun Salute"; and

Whereas 21 is the number of steps the Sentinel takes to face the Tomb of the Unknowns and the Sentinel faces the Tomb of the Unknowns for 21 seconds; and

Whereas observing a 21-second moment of silence is an appropriate way to honor our fallen soldiers and to help this and future generations to understand and respect the sacrifice made by service members who have given their lives; and

Whereas the birth year of our country is 1776, the numbers of which add up to and equal 21; now, therefore,

## Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> Oregonians shall be encouraged and allowed to pause for 21 seconds' duration at noon on the 21st day of each month in honor and remembrance of all those who have given their lives in military service in war.
