

# B-Engrossed Senate Bill 699

Ordered by the House June 23  
Including House Amendments dated June 10 and June 23

Sponsored by Senator BURDICK, Representative WILLIAMSON; Senator STEINER HAYWARD

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Broadens exemption to provisions regulating cosmetology disciplines for persons who prepare individual's hair solely for **professional photograph** or theatrical performance. Clarifies that theatrical performance includes professional film or video performance.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

1  
2 Relating to cosmetology disciplines; amending ORS 690.025; and declaring an emergency.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 690.025 is amended to read:

5 690.025. (1) ORS 690.005 to 690.225 do not apply to:

6 [(1)] (a) Persons who perform service without compensation in case of emergency or in domestic  
7 administration.

8 [(2)] (b) Persons licensed by a health professional regulatory board listed in ORS 676.160 who  
9 are acting within the scope of their professional license.

10 [(3)] (c) Persons identified by the Health Licensing Office or Board of Cosmetology by rule who  
11 are acting under the authority of a hospital or long term care facility licensed under ORS 441.025  
12 or a residential facility licensed under ORS 443.415.

13 [(4)] (d) Persons engaged in rendering emergency medical assistance as defined in ORS 30.800.

14 [(5)] (e) Persons licensed by the State Board of Pharmacy, merchants or other individuals when  
15 demonstrating apparatus or supplies for purposes of sale.

16 [(6)] (f) Commissioned medical and surgical officers and personnel of the United States Armed  
17 Services while operating on a military base and personnel of correctional institutions while operat-  
18 ing on the premises of a correctional facility.

19 [(7) *Persons applying temporary makeup, combing hair or applying hair spray for the sole purpose*  
20 *of preparing an individual for a professional photograph or theatrical performance.*]

21 (g) **Subject to subsection (3) of this section, persons applying temporary makeup, combing**  
22 **hair, brushing hair, braiding hair, applying hair spray or holding cream to hair or styling hair**  
23 **through the use of barrettes, ties, clips, ribbons and other similar hair accessories for the**  
24 **sole purpose of preparing an individual for a professional photograph, provided that the per-**  
25 **son does not use any product that alters the keratin of the individual's hair.**

26 (h) **Subject to subsection (3) of this section, persons applying temporary makeup or**  
27 **styling hair by any method for the sole purpose of preparing an individual for a professional**

1 **film or video performance or a theatrical performance.**

2 [(8)] (i) A student while engaged in training at the direction of and under the direct supervision  
3 of the faculty of a school licensed under ORS 345.010 to 345.450 to teach a field of practice. For  
4 purposes of this [subsection] **paragraph**, “field of practice” does not include natural hair care.

5 [(9)] (2) The office may exempt **from ORS 690.005 to 690.225** practitioners providing services  
6 at charitable or fund raising events. In establishing an exemption, the office shall consider and  
7 evaluate each written request on an individual basis.

8 **(3) The office may develop and disseminate guidelines for persons described in subsection**  
9 **(1)(g) and (h) of this section for the purpose of ensuring sanitation and hygiene best prac-**  
10 **tices. The office is not required to adopt rules to implement this subsection.**

11 **SECTION 2. This 2015 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
12 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2015 Act takes effect**  
13 **on its passage.**
