Senate Bill 704

Sponsored by Senator KNOPP (at the request of Johnny Corbin)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes standards and requirements for community classrooms.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to community classrooms.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section, "community classroom" means a combined work
5	and educational experience that is available through a partnership between a local business
6	and a school district and that provides a high school student with:
7	(a) Work experience that a student gains by:
8	(A) Following an employee while the employee performs the employee's regular job du-
9	ties; and
10	(B) Assisting the employee, when appropriate; and
11	(b) Classroom experience that supplements, to the extent practicable, the work experi-
12	ence.
13	(2) A student may participate in a community classroom if the business participating in
14	the community classroom has been approved by the Department of Education. As a condition
15	of approval, the business must show that:
16	(a) The work environment for the community classroom complies with the safety re-
17	quirements of ORS chapter 654 and any other safety standards prescribed by the State Board
18	of Education by rule;
19	(b) A supervisor is available for the community classroom to oversee the work of the
20	student, to evaluate the student, to ensure that the student complies with safety and attire
21	requirements, to provide any necessary medical attention and to make any necessary re-
22	ports; and
23	(c) The student will not be involved in any menial tasks unless the tasks are part of the
24	regular job duties of the employee the student is following.
25	(3)(a) A student participating in a community classroom must be evaluated by the
26	supervisor of the community classroom and a representative of the school district. The
27	evaluation must include determinations whether the student:
28	(A) Complied with safety and attire requirements;
29	(B) Met attendance requirements established for the community classroom and for the
30	school district; and
31	(C) Met performance requirements established for the community classroom and for the
32	school district.

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1 (b) If a student receives an inadequate evaluation under paragraph (a) of this subsection, 2 as determined by the supervisor of the community classroom and the representative of the 3 school district, the student may be denied continued or future participation in the commu-4 nity classroom.

5 (c) If a student receives an adequate evaluation under paragraph (a) of this subsection, 6 as determined by the supervisor of the community classroom and the representative of the 7 school district, the school district shall award the student with course credit.

8 (d) A student may not receive any compensation for participation in a community class 9 room.

(4) A business participating in a community classroom is not obligated to extend an offer
of employment to a student who participated in the community classroom, but may extend
an offer of employment.

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
