Senate Bill 734

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires trial judge to inform jury of power to acquit even if guilt of defendant proven beyond reasonable doubt.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. During a criminal jury trial in which a defendant is charged with a felony
5	before the jury begins deliberations, the court shall instruct the jury as follows: "As jurors
6	if you feel that a conviction would not be a fair or just result in this case, it is within you
7	power to find the defendant not guilty even if you find that the state has proven the
8	defendant's guilt beyond a reasonable doubt."
9	SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2015 Act applies to trials for crimes committed on or afte
10	the effective date of this 2015 Act.
