Senate Bill 746

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Specifies that health professional licensee may not be required to have physical address in this state for eligibility for authorization to practice health profession.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:
5	(a) "Health professional regulatory board" means:
6	(A) A health professional regulatory board as defined in ORS 676.160; or
7	(B) The Health Licensing Office for a board, council or program listed in ORS 676.565.

8 (b) "Licensee" means an individual authorized by a health professional regulatory board

9 to practice the health profession regulated by the health professional regulatory board.

- 10 (2) A licensee who is authorized to use telehealth, telemedicine, telepharmacy or similar
- electronic health care services delivery methods may not be required by the health professional regulatory board regulating the licensee to have a physical address in this state in order to be eligible for authorization to practice the health profession regulated by the health
- 14 professional regulatory board.
- 15 <u>SECTION 2.</u> Section 1 of this 2023 Act applies to authorizations issued or renewed on or 16 after the effective date of this 2023 Act.
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
