## Senate Bill 831

Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (at the request of Tom Barrows)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Expands definition of "supervising physician" to include persons licensed to practice osteopathy or podiatry in this state for purpose of supervising physician assistants.

- 2 Relating to supervising physicians; creating new provisions; and amending ORS 677.495.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
  - **SECTION 1.** ORS 677.495 is amended to read:
    - 677.495. As used in ORS 677.495 to 677.535, unless the context requires otherwise:
  - (1) "Physician assistant" means a person who is licensed in accordance with ORS 677.505 to 677.525.
    - (2) "Practice agreement" means a written agreement between a physician assistant and a supervising physician or supervising physician organization that describes the manner in which the services of the physician assistant will be used.
    - (3) "Supervising physician" means a [physician licensed to practice medicine under this chapter] medical or osteopathic physician licensed under this chapter, or a podiatric physician and surgeon licensed under ORS 677.805 to 677.840, who supervises a physician assistant.
    - (4) "Supervising physician organization" means a group of supervising physicians that collectively supervises a physician assistant.
    - (5) "Supervision" means the acts of overseeing and accepting responsibility for the medical services provided by a physician assistant in accordance with a practice agreement, including regular and routine oversight and chart review.
    - <u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 677.495 by section 1 of this 2017 Act apply to persons licensed to practice medicine, osteopathy or podiatry in this state before, on or after the effective date of this 2017 Act.

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
