SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

Recognizes and honors [______ for his service to his] Sergeant Sean Patrick Fennerty and Chief Warrant Officer 3 Jonathan Shelby Gibson for their service to their country.

1 CONCURRENT RESOLUTION 2 Whereas Sergeant Sean Patrick Fennerty was born on July 2, 1981, in San Diego, California, while his father was on active duty in the United States Navy; and 3 Whereas the Fennerty family moved to Tucson, Arizona, where Sergeant Fennerty attended 4 Fruchthendler Elementary School and St. Cyril School; and 5 Whereas Sergeant Fennerty remained close to his childhood friends in Tucson, and his time in 6 San Diego and Tucson made him a lifelong fan of the San Diego Padres, San Diego Chargers and 7 University of Arizona athletics, especially the basketball team; and 8 Whereas the Fennerty family moved to Portland, Oregon, where Sergeant Fennerty attended St. 9 10 Thomas More Catholic School for eighth grade and graduated from Jesuit High School in 1999; and 11 Whereas in 2004, Sergeant Fennerty graduated from Oregon State University, where he majored in history, was a supervisor in the intramural sports program and was a member of the Sigma Pi 12 fraternity; and 13 Whereas Sergeant Fennerty was a fan of Oregon State University athletics, especially the foot-14 ball team, and he ended every electronic mail message from Iraq with "Go Beavers!"; and 1516 Whereas Sergeant Fennerty joined the United States Army in 2004 and, although he was steered toward Officer Candidate School, he chose to become an enlisted infantry soldier; and 17 Whereas Sergeant Fennerty was deployed to Iraq with the 509th Infantry (Airborne), 4th 18 Brigade Combat Team, 25th Infantry Division; and 19 Whereas Sergeant Fennerty was killed on January 20, 2007, in Anbar Province, while riding in 20 a military vehicle that was struck by a roadside explosive device; and 2122Whereas Sergeant Fennerty was posthumously awarded a Purple Heart and Bronze Star; and 23Whereas Sergeant Fennerty was known for his fierce loyalty and pride in his country, his fellow soldiers, the schools he attended, his friends and family, his Irish heritage and his Catholic faith; 24 25and Whereas Sergeant Fennerty loved children and volunteered with the Police Activities League 26 27in Portland; and

Whereas Sergeant Fennerty enjoyed skiing, fishing, reading and spending time with friends and 1 2 family; and Whereas Sergeant Fennerty hoped to become a high school history teacher after his military 3 4 service; and $\mathbf{5}$ Whereas Sergeant Fennerty will be remembered for his hearty laugh, huge bear hugs and fan-6 tastic grin; and Whereas Sergeant Fennerty was survived by his parents, Dr. M. Brian and Maureen Fennerty, 7 and siblings, Kelly, Colleen and Conor Fennerty; and 8 9 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Jonathan Shelby Gibson was born on February 15, 1981, in 10 Fairbanks, Alaska; and 11 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson lived in many places due to his father's military career, 12 including Alaska, Kentucky and Germany; and Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson loved baseball and played on his school teams; and 13 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson graduated from Central Hardin High School in 14 15Kentucky in 1999; and 16 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson visited Oregon many times while growing up, staying on his grandparents' farm in Aurora and, following his high school graduation, he moved there to 17 18 live with his father; and 19 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson enlisted in the United States Navy in 1999 and spent 20the following nine years at Naval Air Station North Island in San Diego, California, where he served 21as a rescue swimmer and an air warfare specialist; and 22Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson also served as a helicopter crew chief and completed 23two sea deployments, serving primarily in the Middle East; and Whereas in 2008, Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson applied to flight school, which he attended 24 25from 2009 to 2011 in Pensacola, Florida; and Whereas in 2011, Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson returned to San Diego as a pilot and was as-2627signed to Helicopter Sea Combat Squadron SIX, nicknamed the "Screamin' Indians"; and Whereas in February 2013, Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson and his squadron were deployed to 28the Middle East in support of Operation Enduring Freedom; and 2930 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson was killed on September 22, 2013, when his helicopter 31 crashed while trying to land aboard the USS William P. Lawrence in heavy seas; and Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson was a proud naval aviator who earned numerous 32achievement and commendation medals and awards during his exemplary career; and 33 34 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson completed a college degree while serving in the Navy; 35and Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson hoped to become a flight instructor in the Navy and 36 37 to become an aeronautical engineer after his retirement from the Navy; and 38 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson enjoyed surfing, golfing, mountain biking, motorcycles and playing with his children; and 39 40 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson was known for his strong sense of duty and as a kind, loving and generous man who was devoted to his family; and 41 42 Whereas Chief Warrant Officer 3 Gibson was survived by his wife, Christina Gibson, children, Makaylin and Alexander Gibson, father and stepmother, Scott and Kelly Gibson, mother and 43 stepfather, Jo Ann and Mike Lake, and brother, Sergeant First Class James Gibson; now, therefore, 44
