Senate Concurrent Resolution 3

Sponsored by Senator HANSELL (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Designates potato as official vegetable of Oregon.

2	Whereas potatoes are a vital, versatile and easy-to-use food source for Oregonians from all cul-
3	tural backgrounds and across all levels of income; and
4	Whereas potatoes are nutritious, packed with vitamins B6 and C, potassium, iron and fiber, and
5	are low in sodium, fat-free, cholesterol-free and gluten-free; and
6	Whereas potatoes are a cost-effective, nutrient-dense and child-friendly component of K-12 school
7	breakfasts and lunches, and can play a key role in minimizing plate waste in schools; and
8	Whereas potatoes are grown in all corners of Oregon, contributing to the health and economic
9	well-being of the entire state; and
10	Whereas Baker, Jefferson, Klamath, Malheur, Morrow, Multnomah, Umatilla and Union Coun-
11	ties lead the way in volume of potato production; and
12	Whereas potatoes represent a crucial piece of Oregon's diverse and unique agricultural sector
13	and
14	Whereas potatoes produced by Oregon's organic, commercial and multigenerational potato farms
15	are this state's top-selling vegetable and its seventh most valuable agricultural commodity; and
16	Whereas Oregon potatoes are exported to markets such as Japan, Taiwan, Korea, the
17	Philippines, Mexico and South America, making them a significant component of this state's inter-
18	national trade; and
19	Whereas Oregon farmers have donated one million pounds of potatoes annually to the Oregon
20	Food Bank; now, therefore,
21	Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:
22	That we, the members of the Eighty-second Legislative Assembly, designate the potato as the
23	official vegetable of the State of Oregon.
