17 (3) A payment to an ineligible recipient.

(4) A payment for an ineligible service.

(5) A payment for a duplicative or redundant service. 19

(6) A payment for services not received.

21 (7) A payment for goods and services that does not

22 utilize or was not given available discounts.

23 "Payment." A payment, including a commitment for a future payment, that is made by a Commonwealth agency or a contractor 24 25 with a Commonwealth agency and utilizes Federal or State money.

27 Section 4. Assessment of improper payments.

28 (a) Assessment.--No less than once every two years, a 29 Commonwealth agency shall conduct an assessment of improper payments on any program which is not required under Federal law. 30 31 A Commonwealth agency shall conduct an initial assessment of 32 improper payments no later than 120 days after the effective 33 date of this section.

(b) Contents.--As part of the assessment under subsection 34 35 (a), a Commonwealth agency shall:

(1) Determine whether the programs operated by the 36

1 Commonwealth agency have a low, moderate or high risk of 2 resulting in improper payments based on each program's total 3 amount of improper payments in dollars and total improper 4 payments as a percentage of each program's total 5 expenditures. 6 Explain the reasons why the programs operated by the (2)7 Commonwealth have been assessed as having a low, moderate or high risk of resulting in improper payments. 8 9 Discover and report the root causes of improper (3) 10 payments within high-risk programs. 11 (4) Utilize statistical sampling and extrapolation to 12 calculate an improper payment error rate for high-risk 13 programs. (5) Adopt a corrective action plan to reduce improper 14 15 payment error rates to no more than 3% for high-risk programs 16 for the next occurring biennial assessment. 17 (C) Copies.--A Commonwealth agency shall provide an 18 electronic copy of the assessment under subsection (a) to all of 19 the following: 20 The Secretary of the Budget. (1)21 The Office of the Inspector General. (2) 22 (3) The Department of the Auditor General. 23 (4) The Independent Fiscal Office. 24 (5) Members of the General Assembly. 25 Section 5. Public information on payments and programs of 26 Commonwealth agencies. 27 The Office of the Budget shall maintain a publicly accessible 28 Internet website and update the website to inform the public of, 29 at a minimum, all of the following information: 30 (1) Each Commonwealth agency's biennial improper payment 31 assessments. 32 (2) Each Commonwealth agency's total improper payments 33 in dollar value and total improper payment error rate. 34 (3) Each Commonwealth agency's high-risk program, the 35 dollar value of improper payments for each high-risk program 36 and the improper payment error rate percentage for each high-37 risk program. 38 (4) Each Commonwealth agency's high-risk program corrective action plan and a summary status of completing the 39 40 corrective action plan. 41 (5) The recovery of improper payments for each program 42 in total dollars and by percentage.
