SUMMARY:

House Bill 787 removes the prohibition on elected borough officials in a borough of 3,000 or more people from serving as an employee of that borough.

ANALYSIS:

House Bill 787 amends Title 8 (Boroughs and Incorporated Towns), Chapter 11 (Powers, Duties and Rights or Appointed Officers and Employees) by removing the prohibition on elected borough officials in a borough of 3,000 or more people from serving as an employee of that borough.

According to the Department of Community and Economic Development's Municipal Statistics, Pennsylvania has 951 boroughs, of which 265 have a population of 3,000 or more.

House Bill 787 takes effect in 60 days.

FISCAL IMPACT:

House Bill 787 would have no fiscal impact on commonwealth funds.

House Bill 787 would have no fiscal impact for boroughs in Pennsylvania.
