AN ACT

- Amending Title 65 (Public Officers) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for ethics and disclosure; in ethics standards and financial disclosure, further 3 providing for definitions, for restricted activities, for statement of financial interests and for penalties; and, in 5 lobbying disclosure, further providing for definitions, for reporting and for prohibited activities. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:

- 27 <u>solicit or accept any of the following from a lobbyist,</u>
- 28 principal or lobbying firm for the non-governmental use of the
- 29 <u>State public official or public employee or another:</u>
- 30 (1) A gift or gifts from a source which are valued in

- the aggregate at \$250 or more in a calendar year. This
- 2 paragraph does not apply to a gift or gifts received from a
- 3 <u>spouse, parent, parent by marriage, sibling, child,</u>
- 4 grandchild or other family member when the circumstances make
- 5 <u>it clear that the motivation for the action was a family</u>
- 6 relationship.

- 7 (f) Civil penalty. -- In addition to any other civil remedy or
- 8 criminal penalty provided for in this chapter, the commission
- 9 may, after notice has been served in accordance with section
- 10 1107(5) (relating to powers and duties of commission) and upon a
- 11 majority vote of its members, levy a civil penalty upon any
- 12 person subject to this chapter in accordance with the following:
- (1) A person who fails to file a statement of financial
- interests in a timely manner or who files a deficient
- statement of financial interests[,] shall be subject to a
- 16 <u>civil penalty</u> at a rate of not more than \$25 for each day
- 17 such statement remains delinquent or deficient. The maximum
- penalty payable under this paragraph is \$250.

- subject to a civil penalty of not more than \$500 per
- 21 violation plus the value of the gift, transportation, lodging
- 22 or recreation and entertainment received in violation of
- 23 section 1103(k).

- 3 "Gift." Anything which is received without consideration of
- 4 equal or greater value. The term shall not include a political
- 5 contribution otherwise reportable as required by law or a
- 6 commercially reasonable loan made in the ordinary course of
- 7 business. The term shall not include [hospitality] meals and
- 8 <u>beverages</u>, <u>recreation</u> and <u>entertainment</u>, transportation or
- 9 lodging.
- 10 ["Hospitality." Includes all of the following:
- 11 (1) Meals.
- 12 (2) Beverages.
- 13 (3) Recreation and entertainment.
- 14 The term shall not include gifts, transportation or lodging.]

- 16 "Lobbying." An effort to influence legislative action or
- 17 administrative action in this Commonwealth. The term includes:
- 18 (1) direct or indirect communication;
- 19 (2) office expenses; and
- 20 (3) providing any gift, [hospitality] meals and
- 21 beverages, recreation and entertainment, transportation or
- lodging to a State official or employee for the purpose of
- advancing the interest of the lobbyist or principal.

- 25 "Lodging." Sleeping accommodations for a public official or
- 26 public employee, received without consideration of equal or
- 27 greater value.
- 28 "Meals and beverages." Food and drink for human consumption.

- 30 "Recreation and entertainment." An activity for enjoyment or

- 1 amusement, received without consideration of equal or greater
- 2 value.

- in its entirety among the following categories:
