## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 42 (Judiciary and
- 2 Judicial Procedure) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 3 Statutes, in assault, further providing for the offense of
- ethnic intimidation; and, in particular rights and
- 5 immunities, further prohibiting civil rights violations.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Section 2710 heading, (a) and (c) of Title 18 of
- 9 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, amended by the act of
- 10 December 3, 2002 (P.L.1176, No.143), declared unconstitutional,
- 11 936 A.2d 188 (Pa. Commonwealth 2007), affirmed, 951 A.2d 345
- 12 (2008), are amended and the section is amended by adding a
- 13 subsection to read:
- 14 § 2710. [Ethnic] <u>Hate-based</u> intimidation.
- 15 (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the offense of
- 16 [ethnic] <a href="https://hate-based">hate-based</a> intimidation if, with malicious intention

- 1 toward the race, color, religion [or], national origin,
- 2 <u>ethnicity</u>, <u>ancestry</u>, <u>sex</u>, <u>gender</u>, <u>gender identity</u>, <u>gender</u>
- 3 expression, sexual orientation or, disability, AGE OR AUTISM <--
- 4 <u>SPECTRUM DISORDER</u> of another individual [or]\_ group of
- 5 individuals[, he commits an offense under any other provision of
- 6 this article or] or a person with whom the individual or group
- 7 <u>is associated, commits a personal injury crime as defined in</u>
- 8 section 103 of the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111),
- 9 known as the Crime Victims Act, WHICH RESULTS IN BODILY INJURY, <--
- 10 <u>an offense</u> under Chapter 33 (relating to arson, criminal
- 11 mischief and other property destruction) [exclusive of section
- 12 3307 (relating to institutional vandalism)] or <u>an offense</u> under
- 13 section 3503 (relating to criminal trespass) with respect to
- 14 such individual or his or her property or with respect to one or
- 15 more members of such group or to their property.

- 17 (b.1) Construction. -- Nothing in this section may be
- 18 construed to prohibit, limit or punish religiously motivated
- 19 speech or conduct that is otherwise protected by the
- 20 Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of
- 21 Pennsylvania or the act of December 9, 2002 (P.L.1701, No.214),
- 22 known as the Religious Freedom Protection Act.
- 23 (c) [Definition] DEFINITIONS.--As used in this section <--
- 24 ["malicious intention" means the], THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND
- 25 PHRASES SHALL HAVE THE MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SUBSECTION
- 26 UNLESS THE CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE:
- 27 "AGE." THE TERM INCLUDES THE LENGTH OF TIME THAT A PERSON
- 28 WHO IS 40 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER HAS LIVED AND THE LENGTH OF TIME
- 29 THAT ANY OTHER PERSON HAS LIVED WHO IS PROTECTED UNDER 29 U.S.C.
- 30 CH. 14 (RELATING TO AGE DISCRIMINATION IN EMPLOYMENT).

- 1 "MALICIOUS INTENT." THE intention to commit any act, the
- 2 commission of which is a necessary element of any offense
- 3 referred to in subsection (a) motivated by hatred toward the
- 4 race, color, religion, ethnicity, ancestry, sex, gender, gender
- 5 identity, gender expression, sexual orientation, disability, <--
- 6 AGE, AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER or national origin of another
- 7 individual or group of individuals.
- 8 Section 2. Section 8309(a) of Title 42 is amended and the
- 9 section is amended by adding a subsection to read:
- 10 § 8309. Civil rights violations.
- 11 (a) Redress for personal injury.--[A person]
- 12 <u>(1) An individual</u> who incurs injury to his <u>or her</u> person
- 13 for damage or loss to his or her property, has been placed <--
- 14 <u>in reasonable fear of bodily injury or suffered an</u>
- 15 <u>intentional infliction of emotional distress</u> as a result of
- 16 conduct described in 18 Pa.C.S. § 2710 (relating to [ethnic]
- 17 <u>hate-based</u> intimidation) or 3307 (relating to institutional
- vandalism) shall have a right of action [against the actor
- for] in a court of common pleas for preliminary or permanent
- injunction, damages or other appropriate civil or equitable
- 21 relief[.] against all of the following:
- (i) The actor.
- (ii) A person who has solicited the actor to engage
- in the conduct.
- 25 <u>(iii) A person who has knowingly attempted to</u>
- 26 provide or provided aid to the actor with the intent that
- 27 <u>the actor engage in the conduct.</u>
- 28 (2) In the action, the issue of whether the defendant
- 29 engaged in the conduct alleged shall be determined according
- 30 to the burden of proof used in other civil actions for

- 1 similar relief.
- 2 <u>(3)</u> The plaintiff may seek recovery for any of the
- 3 following:
- 4 [(1)] <u>(i)</u> General and special damages, including
- 5 damages for emotional distress. Damages under this
- 6 paragraph shall be actual damages or \$500, whichever is
- 7 greater.
- 8 [(2)] <u>(ii)</u> Punitive damages.
- 9 [(3)] (iii) Reasonable attorney fees and costs.
- 10 [(4)] <u>(iv)</u> Injunctive and other equitable relief.
- [(5)]  $\underline{(v)}$  Such other relief which the court deems
- 12 necessary and proper.
- 13 \* \* \*
- 14 (g) Construction. -- Nothing in this section may be construed
- 15 to prohibit, limit or punish religiously motivated speech or
- 16 <u>conduct that is otherwise protected by the Constitution of the</u>
- 17 <u>United States, the Constitution of Pennsylvania or the act of</u>
- 18 December 9, 2002 (P.L.1701, No.214), known as the Religious
- 19 Freedom Protection Act.
- 20 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
