## AN ACT

- 1 Establishing the Lean Government Practices Program; and
- conferring powers and imposing duties on the Governor's
- 3 Innovation Office.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Lean
- 8 Management Practices Act.
- 9 Section 2. Legislative findings.
- 10 The General Assembly finds and declares as follows:
- 11 (1) Lean government practices have helped governments at
- the Federal, state and local levels produce cost savings.
- 13 (2) Since 2011, the Commonwealth has saved \$690 \$699
- 14 million by adopting lean government practices.
- 15 (3) These cost savings stem from eliminating waste, in
- 16 the form of unneeded bureaucratic processes and paperwork, in
- 17 government programs designed to provide constituent services.
- 18 (4) By eliminating waste, government can provide its

- 1 current services at a faster pace and at a lower cost.
- 2 (5) The adoption of lean government practices will

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- 3 assist financially struggling political subdivisions.
- 4 (6) Through the provision of efficient, more effective
- 5 government, lean government practices provide the people with
- 6 a better government that works for them.
- 7 Section 3. Definitions.
- 8 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 9 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 10 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 11 "Financially struggling political subdivision." Any of the <--
- 12 <del>following:</del>
- 13 (1) A municipality which has run large structural
- deficits and is subject to the provisions of the act of July
- 16 Financial Recovery Act.
- 17 (2) A school district under financial recovery status
- 18 under Article VI A of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30,
- 19 No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949.
- 20 "COMMITTEE." THE STEERING COMMITTEE OF THE LEAN GOVERNMENT <--
- 21 PRACTICES PROGRAM.
- "Lean government practices." The application of programs, <--
- 23 SUCH AS SIX SIGMA OR KAIZEN, designed to improve constituent
- 24 service SERVICES through the elimination of waste in bureaucracy <--
- 25 by removing unnecessary steps and processes to improve delivery
- 26 of service to constituents SERVICES in a manner that is faster, <--
- 27 effective and efficient at the lowest, EFFICIENT AND AT A LOWER <--
- 28 cost. The term includes lean six sigma and kaizen.
- "Innovation Office." The Governor's Innovation Office.
- 30 "Program." The Lean Government Practices Program established

- 1 under this act.
- 2 "TRANSFORMATION OFFICE." THE GOVERNOR'S OFFICE OF
- 3 TRANSFORMATION, INNOVATION, MANAGEMENT AND EFFICIENCY.
- 4 Section 4. Lean Government Practices Program.
- 5 (a) Establishment. -- The Lean Government Practices Program is

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- 6 established within the <del>Innovation</del> TRANSFORMATION Office to:
- 7 (1) Provide training in using lean government practices
- 8 to political subdivisions in order to improve their
- 9 constituent services.
- 10 <del>(2) Provide</del> PROVIDE training to State agencies in <--
- 11 training their FOR TRAINING new employees in using lean <--
- 12 government practices.
- 13 (B) STEERING COMMITTEE.--THE PROGRAM SHALL BE DIRECTED BY A <--
- 14 COMMITTEE, WHICH WILL COORDINATE WITH HEADS OF ALL STATE
- 15 AGENCIES. THE COMMITTEE SHALL:
- 16 (1) CONSIST OF:
- 17 (I) THE SECRETARY OF ADMINISTRATION.
- 18 (II) THE DIRECTOR OF THE TRANSFORMATION OFFICE.
- 19 (III) THE SECRETARY OF POLICY AND PLANNING.
- 20 (IV) THE SECRETARY OF GENERAL SERVICES.
- 21 (V) THE SECRETARY OF THE BUDGET.
- 22 (VI) ONE INDIVIDUAL CHOSEN BY THE PRESIDENT PRO
- TEMPORE OF THE SENATE.
- 24 (VII) ONE INDIVIDUAL CHOSEN BY THE MINORITY LEADER
- OF THE SENATE.
- 26 (VIII) ONE INDIVIDUAL CHOSEN BY THE SPEAKER OF THE
- 27 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 28 (IX) ONE INDIVIDUAL CHOSEN BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF
- THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.
- 30 (2) IDENTIFY STATE PROGRAMS AND PROCESSES IN NEED OF

- 1 STREAMLINING TO IMPROVE EFFICIENCY AND DELIVERY OF GOVERNMENT
- 2 SERVICES TO TAXPAYERS.
- 3 (3) DEVELOP TRAINING AND IMPLEMENT STRATEGIES TO ASSIST
- 4 IN THE ADOPTION OF LEAN GOVERNMENT PRACTICES BY STATE
- 5 AGENCIES.
- 6 (b) Participation. All financially struggling political <-
- 7 subdivisions and State agencies shall participate in the
- 8 program. A political subdivision that is not a financially
- 9 struggling political subdivision may participate in the program.
- 10 (c) Administration. The Innovation Office shall administer
- 11 the program and may promulgate regulations to assist in the-
- 12 administration of the program.
- 13 (C) PARTICIPATION.--
- 14 (1) ALL AGENCIES SHALL DESIGNATE CERTAIN EMPLOYEES TO

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- 15 FORM INNOVATION TEAMS TO RECEIVE TRAINING IN LEAN GOVERNMENT
- 16 PRACTICES BY PARTICIPATING IN THE PROGRAM.
- 17 (2) FOLLOWING COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAM, MEMBERS OF THE
- 18 INNOVATION TEAM SHALL BEGIN THE PROCESS OF ADOPTING LEAN
- 19 GOVERNMENT PRACTICES IN THEIR STATE AGENCY.
- 20 (3) FOLLOWING ADOPTION OF LEAN MANAGEMENT PRACTICES,
- 21 STATE AGENCIES MAY REQUEST THAT THE TRANSFORMATION OFFICE
- 22 EXAMINE PROGRAMS AND PROCESSES FOR ADDITIONAL EFFICIENCIES.
- 23 (D) ADMINISTRATION.--
- 24 (1) THE TRANSFORMATION OFFICE SHALL ADMINISTER THE
- 25 PROGRAM AND PROVIDE AN ANNUAL REPORT DETAILING ANY COST
- 26 SAVINGS AND IMPROVED DELIVERY OF SERVICES BY STATE AGENCIES
- 27 FROM THE PROGRAM.
- 28 (2) THE ANNUAL REPORT SHALL BE GIVEN TO THE PRESIDENT
- 29 PRO TEMPORE OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY CHAIRMAN
- 30 OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE SENATE, THE SPEAKER OF THE

- 1 HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES AND THE CHAIRMAN AND MINORITY
- 2 CHAIRMAN OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE OF THE HOUSE OF
- 3 REPRESENTATIVES.
- 4 (3) THE TRANSFORMATION OFFICE MAY PROMULGATE REGULATIONS
- 5 TO ASSIST IN THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM.
- 6 Section 5. Effective date.
- 7 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
