## **HOUSE BILL**

## AN ACT

Amending the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), entitled 1 "An act establishing rights in public employes to organize 2 and bargain collectively through selected representatives; 3 defining public employes to include employes of nonprofit organizations and institutions; providing compulsory mediation and fact-finding, for collective bargaining impasses; providing arbitration for certain public employes 5 6 7 for collective bargaining impasses; defining the scope of 8 9 collective bargaining; establishing unfair employe and employer practices; prohibiting strikes for certain public 10 employes; permitting strikes under limited conditions; 11 providing penalties for violations; and establishing 12 procedures for implementation," in definitions, further 13 14 providing for definitions; in employee rights, providing for payments to employee organizations, for resignation from 15 employee organization and for affirmative consent; in 16 representation, further providing for exclusive 17 representation and providing for recertification; in scope of 18 19 bargaining, further providing for membership dues deductions and maintenance of membership and providing for collection of 20 payments from nonmembers; and making related repeals. 21 22 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 23 hereby enacts as follows: 24 Section 1. Section 301 of the act of July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, 25 No.195), known as the Public Employe Relations Act, is amended 26 by adding clauses to read:

Section 301. As used in this act:

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- 1 \* \* \*
- 2 (20) "Nonmember" means a public employe in a collective
- 3 bargaining unit who is not a member of the employe organization
- 4 that serves as the exclusive representative for the collective
- 5 <u>bargaining unit.</u>
- 6 (21) "Independent bargaining" or "to bargain independently"
- 7 means bargaining between a public employer and a public employe
- 8 with respect to rates of pay, wages, hours of employment,
- 9 <u>adjustment of grievances or other terms and conditions of</u>
- 10 employment without the intervention of an employe organization,
- 11 <u>bargaining agent or exclusive bargaining representative. The</u>
- 12 <u>term does not include:</u>
- (i) granting any greater or lesser rights or privileges to
- 14 public employes who have chosen to represent themselves in a
- 15 <u>unit with an exclusive representative than those public employes</u>
- 16 in a unit without an exclusive bargaining representative; or
- 17 (ii) granting any greater or lesser duties or obligations
- 18 for a public employer to public employes who have chosen to
- 19 represent themselves in a unit with an exclusive bargaining
- 20 representative than those duties or obligations the public
- 21 employer owes to public employes in a unit without an exclusive
- 22 bargaining representative.
- 23 (22) "Affirmative consent" means a knowing, voluntary and
- 24 explicit agreement by a public employe to financially support an
- 25 <u>employe organization and to waive the employe's right or</u>
- 26 privilege not to do so, in written form and signed by the public
- 27 employe.
- 28 (23) "Political contribution" means money appropriated for
- 29 any of the following:
- 30 (i) A contribution, as defined in section 1621 of the act of

- 1 <u>June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the "Pennsylvania</u>
- 2 Election Code."
- 3 (ii) An independent expenditure, as defined in section 1621
- 4 of the "Pennsylvania Election Code."
- 5 (iii) An expenditure, as defined in section 1621 of the
- 6 "Pennsylvania Election Code."
- 7 (iv) Lobbying, as defined in 65 Pa.C.S. § 13A03 (relating to
- 8 definitions).
- 9 <u>(v) A voter registration drive.</u>
- 10 (vi) A get-out-the-vote drive.
- 11 (vii) Any other electoral, political or legislative purpose.
- 12 Section 2. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
- 13 <u>Section 402. (a) A public employer shall notify, in</u>
- 14 writing, all public employes in a collective bargaining unit
- 15 that there is no statutory obligation by nonmembers to make any
- 16 payments to the employe organization that serves as the
- 17 nonmember's exclusive representative. The notice shall specify
- 18 the following:
- 19 (1) A payment may not be made to the employe organization
- 20 unless the employe affirmatively consents to make the payment.
- 21 (2) A payment to the employe organization shall not be
- 22 necessary to maintain employment.
- 23 (b) The notice required under subsection (a) shall be given
- 24 annually and may be given by mailing a letter by first class
- 25 mail to the address of the employe organization or other means
- 26 <u>deemed appropriate by the board.</u>
- 27 <u>(c) Prior to the hiring of an applicant as a new public</u>
- 28 employe, the public employer, when applicable, shall notify the
- 29 <u>applicant of the following:</u>
- 30 (1) Membership in the employe organization that serves as

- 1 the exclusive representative of the collective bargaining unit
- 2 <u>is not a condition of employment with the public employer.</u>
- 3 (2) The applicant may opt to be a nonmember by not giving
- 4 <u>affirmative consent. As a nonmember, the applicant has no</u>
- 5 statutory obligation to make a payment to the employe
- 6 <u>organization</u>.
- 7 <u>Section 403. (a) No collective bargaining agreement entered</u>
- 8 <u>into on or after the effective date of this section may</u>
- 9 <u>establish conditions for when a public employe may join or</u>
- 10 resign from an employe organization acting as the exclusive
- 11 <u>representative of a unit.</u>
- 12 (b) A public employe may resign from an employe organization
- 13 at any time.
- 14 (c) Resignation shall become effective thirty days after the
- 15 date of mailing a letter by first class mail to the address of
- 16 the employe organization or other means deemed appropriate by
- 17 the board.
- 18 (d) A stamped receipt from a United States Post Office or
- 19 other evidence deemed appropriate by the board shall constitute
- 20 proof of mailing.
- 21 Section 404. (a) No membership dues or any portion of
- 22 membership dues may be deducted from the wages of a public
- 23 employe, except on receipt by the public employer of the
- 24 affirmative consent of the employe within the previous twelve
- 25 months.
- 26 (b) Affirmative consent provided to public employers shall
- 27 <u>include the following language:</u>
- I recognize that I have a First Amendment right to
- 29 <u>associate. My rights provide that I am not compelled to</u>
- 30 <u>pay an employe organization as a condition of employment,</u>

- and I do not have to sign this waiver. However, I am
- 2 <u>hereby choosing to associate with the herein named</u>
- 3 <u>employe organization and affirmatively consent to allow</u>
- 4 <u>my employer to deduct payments to such employe</u>
- 5 <u>organization until such time as I choose to revoke this</u>
- 6 <u>authorization</u>.
- 7 (c) The provision under subsection (b) shall be written in
- 8 bold and in all caps and shall be in a font that is equal to or
- 9 <u>larger than any other font found in the text of the form. The</u>
- 10 waiver shall be contained in a separate document and shall not
- 11 be a part of a document that serves additional purposes or has
- 12 <u>additional provisions.</u>
- 13 (d) An employe labor organization may present a public
- 14 employe with an affirmative consent form on the commencement of
- 15 employment, but not more often than twice annually thereafter.
- 16 If any information related to the waiver or the potential
- 17 execution of the affirmative consent is provided to an employe
- 18 in any form, representatives of the employer and any relevant
- 19 union shall be given the equivalent ability to provide
- 20 information in the same format to the employe.
- 21 (e) No deadline or any other like requirement may be placed
- 22 on an employe for the potential execution of an affirmative
- 23 consent.
- 24 (f) The following is prohibited in a communication or action
- 25 that is in any manner related to the potential execution of an
- 26 <u>affirmative consent:</u>
- 27 (1) Requiring an employe to attend a meeting with the
- 28 purpose of influencing the decision of the employe to execute or
- 29 not execute the affirmative consent.
- 30 (2) Requesting an employe to announce the employe's decision

- 1 to execute or not to execute the affirmative consent at a
- 2 particular place or time.
- 3 (3) A communication by any means directed at an employe's
- 4 home.
- 5 (4) A communication directed in any manner, direct or
- 6 <u>indirect</u>, to a person other than the employe himself or herself\_
- 7 <u>or other employes of the same employer.</u>
- 8 (5) The promise or provision of an inducement or thing of
- 9 value, other than a description of membership benefits in the
- 10 union in question.
- 11 (6) The threat of negative action of any kind, including
- 12 placement on a public list or exclusion from a benefit, event or
- 13 <u>activity that is a part of the employe's employment.</u>
- 14 Section 3. Section 606 of the act is amended to read:
- 15 Section 606. (a) Representatives selected by public
- 16 employes in a unit appropriate for collective bargaining
- 17 purposes shall be the exclusive representative of all the
- 18 employes in such unit that have not chosen to independently
- 19 <u>bargain</u> to bargain on wages, hours, terms and conditions of
- 20 employment[: Provided, That any]. An individual employe or a
- 21 group of employes shall have the right at any time to [present
- 22 grievances to their employer and to have them adjusted]
- 23 independently bargain without the intervention of the bargaining
- 24 representative [as long as the adjustment is not inconsistent
- 25 with the terms of a collective bargaining contract then in
- 26 effect: And, provided further, That the bargaining
- 27 representative has been given an opportunity to be present at
- 28 such adjustment].
- 29 (b) Public employes shall have the right to independently
- 30 bargain in the employes' relations with the public employer.

- 1 (c) No provision of an agreement between an employe
- 2 <u>organization and a public employer or any other public policy</u>
- 3 <u>shall impose representation by the employe organization on</u>
- 4 public employes who are not members of that organization and
- 5 have chosen to bargain independently. Nothing in a collective
- 6 bargaining agreement shall limit a public employe's ability to
- 7 <u>negotiate with the employe's public employer or adjust the</u>
- 8 <u>employe's grievances directly with the employe's public</u>
- 9 <u>employer</u>, nor shall a resolution of any such negotiation or
- 10 grievance be controlled or limited by the terms of a collective
- 11 <u>bargaining agreement.</u>
- 12 (d) There shall be not more than one exclusive bargaining
- 13 representative designated by the board pursuant to the
- 14 provisions of this act as the representative of public employes
- 15 <u>in an appropriate collective bargaining unit.</u>
- (e) No provision of an agreement between an employe
- 17 organization and a public employer or any other public policy
- 18 shall impose wages or conditions of employment for members of an
- 19 employe organization that are linked or contingent on wages or
- 20 conditions of employment to public employes who are not members
- 21 of the employe organization.
- 22 Section 4. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 23 Section 608. (a) The board shall conduct periodic
- 24 recertification elections using a secret ballot vote among the
- 25 public employes in a collective bargaining unit to determine if
- 26 the majority of the employes desire to continue representation.
- 27 (b) The board shall conduct recertification elections on
- 28 expiration of a collective bargaining agreement, but not less
- 29 <u>than every three years.</u>
- 30 (c) To meet the recertification requirement, continuation of

- 1 the employe organization's status as the representative shall be
- 2 favored in a secret ballot election conducted by the board by
- 3 more than fifty per cent of the public employes in the
- 4 <u>collective bargaining unit.</u>
- 5 (d) If public employes vote not to continue representation
- 6 <u>under subsection (c), the current representative's duties,</u>
- 7 <u>including collection of dues, fees and grievance arbitration,</u>
- 8 shall terminate and the collective bargaining agreement shall
- 9 remain in effect with respect to wages, hours and conditions of
- 10 employment.
- 11 (e) If public employes do not recertify the public employes'
- 12 current representative under subsection (c), public employes in
- 13 the unit may certify a new representative in accordance with
- 14 this section, provided public employes cannot certify a
- 15 representative affiliated with or substantially similar to the
- 16 <u>decertified representative for two years following the date of</u>
- 17 decertification.
- 18 (f) The board shall assess and collect a fee from each
- 19 representative participating in an election conducted under this
- 20 section for the purpose of paying for the election as follows:
- 21 (1) For a bargaining unit of one to one hundred members, a
- 22 fee of two hundred dollars (\$200).
- 23 (2) For a bargaining unit of one hundred one to two hundred
- 24 fifty members, a fee of three hundred fifty dollars (\$350).
- 25 (3) For a bargaining unit of two hundred fifty-one to five
- 26 hundred members, a fee of five hundred dollars (\$500).
- 27 (4) For a bargaining unit of five hundred one to one
- 28 thousand members, a fee of seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750).
- 29 (5) For a bargaining unit of one thousand one to three
- 30 thousand members, a fee of one thousand five hundred dollars

- $1 \quad (\$1,500).$
- 2 (6) For a bargaining unit of more than three thousand
- 3 members, a fee of two thousand dollars (\$2,000).
- 4 Section 5. Section 705 of the act is amended to read:
- 5 Section 705. [Membership dues deductions and maintenance of
- 6 membership are proper subjects of bargaining with the proviso
- 7 that as to the latter, the payment of dues and assessments while
- 8 members, may be the only requisite employment condition.] On or
- 9 after the effective date of section 705.1, maintenance of
- 10 membership shall not be a proper subject of bargaining, and no
- 11 collective bargaining agreement entered into on or after the
- 12 effective date of section 705.1 may contain the provision.
- 13 Section 6. The act is amended by adding sections to read:
- 14 <u>Section 705.1. (a) A collective bargaining agreement</u>
- 15 entered into, renewed or extended on or after the effective date
- 16 of this section may not contain provisions requiring the
- 17 deduction of political contributions or membership dues
- 18 deductions from a public employe's wages, including, without
- 19 limitation, wages of public school employes covered by the act
- 20 of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the "Public School
- 21 Code of 1949."
- 22 (b) A public employer may not deduct political contributions
- 23 or membership dues from the wages of a public employe, including
- 24 public school employes covered by the "Public School Code of
- 25 1949," except as required by a valid collective bargaining
- 26 agreement entered into between a public employer and a
- 27 <u>representative of its employes prior to the effective date of</u>
- 28 this section.
- 29 (c) This section shall not apply to any of the following:
- 30 (1) Employes of a public employer who are not permitted to

- 1 <u>strike under section 1001.</u>
- 2 (2) Employes of a public employer who are subject to the act
- 3 of June 24, 1968 (P.L.237, No.111), referred to as the
- 4 "Policemen and Firemen Collective Bargaining Act."
- 5 <u>Section 705.2. A public employer may not collect through a</u>
- 6 wage deduction any form of payment from a nonmember to an
- 7 employe organization.
- 8 Section 7. Repeals are as follows:
- 9 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeals under
- 10 paragraph (2) are necessary to effectuate the addition of
- 11 sections 301(20), 402 and 705.2 of the act.
- 12 (2) The following acts and parts of acts are repealed:
- 13 (i) Section 2215 of the act of April 9, 1929
- 14 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of
- 15 1929.
- 16 (ii) The act of June 2, 1993 (P.L.45, No.15), known
- as the Public Employee Fair Share Fee Law.
- 18 Section 8. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
