AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain 2
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 5
 - laws relating thereto," in safe schools, providing for parental notification of certain incidents.

- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows: 8
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a 10
- 11 section to read:
- Section 1314-A. Parental Notification. -- (a) All school 12
- entities shall adopt a policy and procedures for notification, 13
- in a timely manner, of all parents, quardians or custodial 14
- parents of students involved in incidents which are required to 15
- be reported in the school safety report submitted to the 16
- 17 Department of Education and of students who incur other serious
- 18 <u>injuries on school property</u>, on the school bus or at a school
- 19 activity.

- 1 (b) Parents, quardians or custodial parents of students are
- 2 <u>defined for purposes of this section as parents, quardians or</u>
- 3 <u>custodial parents of students that are either perpetrators or</u>
- 4 <u>victims of incidents which are required to be reported in the</u>
- 5 school safety report submitted to the Department of Education
- 6 and any other injuries occurring on school property, the school
- 7 <u>bus or at a school activity.</u>
- 8 (c) Parents, quardians or custodial parents may be notified
- 9 <u>in person, by telephone, by e-mail, by text messages or by</u>
- 10 certified mail. School entities shall make a reasonable effort
- 11 to notify a parent, guardian or custodial parent in the
- 12 preferred manner indicated on the contact information of the
- 13 parent, guardian or custodial parent. The preferred method of
- 14 <u>notification must be documented. In the event of a school or</u>
- 15 <u>district-wide emergency</u>, the school entity may use alternative
- 16 methods to notify parents, guardians or custodial parents.
- 17 (d) A school entity must maintain current contact
- 18 information for each parent, quardian or custodial parent. The
- 19 contact information must allow parents, guardians and custodial
- 20 parents to identify a preferred method of contact in the event
- 21 that parental notification is required.
- 22 (e) Each school entity shall provide training regarding the
- 23 requirements of this section to all staff who come into contact
- 24 with children. The training shall include recognizing incidents
- 25 that trigger the notification requirement, the school entity's
- 26 policy and procedure for notification and any record-keeping and
- 27 reporting requirements. Training required under this section may
- 28 be incorporated with other training and in-service activities of
- 29 the school entity.
- 30 (f) All incidents that are required to be reported under

- 1 <u>section 1303-A(b)</u> shall be subject to the requirements of this
- 2 <u>section</u>.
- 3 (g) The Secretary of Education may withhold State payments
- 4 to any school district that fails to comply with this section.
- 5 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
