AN ACT

1 Making appropriations from the General Fund to the Department of
2 Labor and Industry for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
3 2019, and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining
4 unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.

5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6 hereby enacts as follows:

8 PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

9 Section 101. Short title.

10 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Appropriation
11 Act of 2019 - Department of Labor and Industry.

15 Section 301. Appropriations from General Fund.

17 necessary, are hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the
