AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in Commonwealth budget procedures, further 21 providing for transmission of budget information to the 22 23 General Assembly. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 25 hereby enacts as follows:
- 26 Section 1. Section 619 of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177,
- 27 No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by
- 28 adding a subsection to read:

- 1 Section 619. Transmission of Budget Information to the
- 2 General Assembly.--* * *
- 3 (a.1) The following apply:
- 4 (1) After December 1 and no later than the date of the
- 5 Governor's briefing under subsection (a), the Secretary of the
- 6 Budget shall evaluate the official revenue estimate for the
- 7 <u>fiscal year in comparison to year-to-date revenue collections</u>
- 8 and updated projections of collections for the remainder of the
- 9 <u>fiscal year and shall project the difference between the</u>
- 10 official revenue estimate for the fiscal year and the year-to-
- 11 date revenue collections plus updated projections of collections
- 12 for the remainder of the fiscal year. The Secretary of the
- 13 Budget shall provide documentation of the projection under this
- 14 paragraph to the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 15 Appropriations Committee of the Senate, the chairperson and
- 16 minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the
- 17 House of Representatives, the Independent Fiscal Office and the
- 18 members of the General Assembly.
- 19 (2) If the Secretary of the Budget projects that the updated
- 20 projection of actual revenue collections for the fiscal year
- 21 will be less than the official revenue estimate for the fiscal
- 22 year, the Secretary of the Budget shall disapprove or reduce
- 23 amounts under section 615 from the departments, boards and
- 24 commissions to which section 615 applies in an amount equal to
- 25 the projected difference.
- 26 (3) After the revenue conference under section 608-B, the
- 27 Secretary of the Budget shall revise the projection of the
- 28 <u>difference under clause (1) and shall ensure that the amounts</u>
- 29 disapproved or reduced under clause (2) are no less than the
- 30 <u>revised estimate of the difference under clause (1), at least</u>

- 1 once per month until the end of the fiscal year.

- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2023, or
- 4 immediately, whichever is later.
