AN ACT

- 1 Prohibiting restrictions on household appliances by Commonwealth
- agencies and municipalities; and providing for civil actions
- 3 authorized.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Household
- 8 Appliance Freedom Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Commonwealth agency." Any office, department, authority,
- 14 board, multistate agency or commission of the executive branch.
- 15 "Municipality." Any of the following:
- 16 (1) A county, city, borough, incorporated town or

- 1 township.
- 2 (2) A home rule, optional plan or optional charter
- 3 municipality.
- 4 (3) Any other general purpose unit of government
- 5 established by the General Assembly.
- 6 (4) A municipal authority.
- 7 (5) An entity formed under 53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 23 Subch. A
- 8 (relating to intergovernmental cooperation).
- 9 "Policy." A requirement, including a zoning or building code
- 10 requirement or restriction, which is imposed by statute
- 11 regulation, ordinance, resolution, rule, guideline, code,
- 12 general or specific plan provision or otherwise.
- 13 Section 3. Prohibition on restrictions on household appliances.
- 14 A Commonwealth agency or municipality may not adopt a policy
- 15 to prohibit the sale, installation or use of any of the
- 16 following:
- 17 (1) Natural gas-powered home heating equipment.
- 18 (2) Natural gas-powered home appliances.
- 19 (3) Grills, stoves and other food preparation appliances
- designed to be used outdoors.
- 21 (4) Natural gas powered-torches, lamps and other
- features designed to be used outdoors.
- 23 (5) Any other home or outdoor appliances or heating
- 24 equipment powered by a specific energy source.
- 25 Section 4. Civil actions authorized.
- 26 A person who alleges a violation of section 3 may bring a
- 27 civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction for injunctive
- 28 relief or other appropriate damages within 180 days after the
- 29 occurrence of the alleged violation.
- 30 Section 5. Effective date.

1 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
