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| 2 | The intent of this chapter is to reduce the adverse |
| 3 | environmental impact of single-use plastic straws. |
| 4 | <u>§ 4302. Definitions.</u> |
| 5 | The following words and phrases when used in this chapter |
| 6 | shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the |
| 7 | context clearly indicates otherwise: |
| 8 | "Department." The Department of Environmental Protection of |
| 9 | the Commonwealth. |
| 10 | "Food establishment." All sales outlets, stores, shops or |
| 11 | other places of business located within this Commonwealth which |
| 12 | operate primarily to sell or convey food directly to the |
| 13 | ultimate consumer, which food is predominately contained, |
| 14 | wrapped or held in or on packaging. The term includes any place |
| 15 | where food is prepared, mixed, cooked, baked, smoked, preserved, |
| 16 | bottled, packaged, handled, stored, manufactured and sold or |
| 17 | offered for sale, including, but not limited to, any fixed or |
| 18 | mobile restaurant, drive-in, coffee shop, cafeteria, short order |
| 19 | cafe, delicatessen, luncheonette, grill, sandwich shop, soda |
| 20 | <u>fountain, tavern, bar, cocktail lounge, nightclub, roadside</u> |
| 21 | stand, prepared food take-out place, industrial feeding |
| 22 | establishment, catering kitchen, commissary, grocery store, |
| 23 | public food market, food stand or similar place in which food or |
| 24 | drink is prepared for sale or for service on the premises or |
| 25 | elsewhere, and any other establishment or operation, including |
| 26 | homes, where food is processed, prepared, stored, served or |
| 27 | provided for the public for charge. |
| 28 | "Retailer." A person that purchases or receives products |
| 29 | from any source for the purpose of sale to a consumer. |
| 30 | "Single-use plastic straw." A single-use, disposable tube |

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| 1 | made predominantly of plastic derived from either petroleum or a |
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| 2 | biologically based polymer, such as corn or other plant sources, |
| 3 | used to transfer a beverage from a container to the mouth of the |
| 4 | person drinking the beverage. The term does not include a straw |
| 5 | made from nonplastic materials, including, but not limited to, |
| 6 | <u>paper, pasta, sugar cane, wood or bamboo.</u> |
| 7 | <u>§ 4303. Prohibition.</u> |
| 8 | (a) Food establishmentA food establishment is prohibited |
| 9 | from selling, giving or providing single-use plastic straws |
| 10 | except on the specific request of a customer. |
| 11 | (b) RetailerA retailer is prohibited from selling, giving |
| 12 | or providing single-use plastic straws except on the specific |
| 13 | request of a customer. |
| 14 | <u>§ 4304. Complaints.</u> |
| 15 | The department shall prescribe a procedure for a person to |
| 16 | file a complaint with the department for a violation of this |
| 17 | <u>chapter.</u> |
| 18 | <u>§ 4305. Compliance.</u> |
| 19 | The department shall develop and maintain a publicly |
| 20 | accessible Internet website with all of the following: |
| 21 | (1) A description of the information necessary to comply |
| 22 | with the prohibition under section 4303 (relating to |
| 23 | prohibition). |
| 24 | (2) A description of the procedure under section 4304 |
| 25 | (relating to complaints) to file a complaint with the |
| 26 | department for a violation of the prohibition under this |
| 27 | <u>chapter.</u> |
| 28 | <u>§ 4306. Regulations.</u> |
| 29 | The department may promulgate rules and regulations necessary |
| 30 | to implement the provisions of this chapter. |

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1 <u>§ 4307. Penalties.</u>

| 2 | (a) ImpositionThe department may impose a civil penalty |
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| 3 | in the following amounts for a violation of this chapter: |
| 4 | <u>(1) For a first violation, \$500.</u> |
| 5 | <u>(2) For a second violation, \$1,000.</u> |
| 6 | (3) For a third or subsequent violation, \$2,000. |
| 7 | (b) PaymentAny civil penalty collected under subsection |
| 8 | (a) shall be paid to the department. |
| 9 | (c) Local lawThis chapter shall preempt any ordinance or |
| 10 | resolution passed or adopted by any political subdivision that |
| 11 | is effective on or before or after the effective date of this |
| 12 | chapter to the extent that the ordinance or resolution conflicts |
| 13 | or is inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter. |
| 14 | Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days. |
