## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school finances, providing for internal auditing and reporting requirements.

  The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

  hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Subarticle (a) of Article VI of the act of March
- 10 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of
- 11 1949, is amended by adding a section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 618. Internal auditing and reporting requirements.--</u>
- 13 (a) Each school entity shall form an independent audit
- 14 committee which shall review a complete certified audit of the
- 15 operations of the school entity at the close of each fiscal
- 16 year. The audit shall be conducted by a qualified independent
- 17 <u>certified public accountant as selected from a list of approved</u>
- 18 providers established by the department. The audit shall be
- 19 conducted under generally accepted audit standards of the
- 20 Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) and shall

- 1 <u>include</u>, but not be limited to, the following tests:
- 2 (1) An enrollment test to verify the accuracy of student
- 3 enrollment and reporting to the Commonwealth.
- 4 (2) Full review of expense reimbursements for board members
- 5 and administrators, including sampling of all reimbursements.
- 6 (3) Review of internal controls, including review of
- 7 <u>receipts and disbursements.</u>
- 8 (4) Review of annual Federal and State tax filings,
- 9 including the Internal Revenue Service Code Form 990, Return of
- 10 Organization Exempt From Income Tax and all related schedules
- 11 and appendices for the school entity and school entity
- 12 <u>foundation</u>, <u>if applicable and</u>, <u>including any educational</u>
- 13 management service providers of the school entity.
- 14 (5) Review of the financials of a school entity foundation,
- 15 <u>including any educational management service providers of the</u>
- 16 school entity.
- 17 (6) Review of all contracts over five thousand dollars
- 18 (\$5,000) regarding the selection and acceptance process.
- 19 (7) Review of potential conflicts of interest among board
- 20 members and senior level administrators with employes or
- 21 educational management service providers of the school entity.
- 22 (8) Review of employe files for compliance purposes but in
- 23 accordance with Federal and State regulations governing
- 24 <u>confidentiality protection for employes.</u>
- 25 (9) Any other test the department deems appropriate.
- 26 (b) The certified audit as required by subsection (a) is a
- 27 <u>public document and shall be made available on the department's</u>
- 28 publicly accessible Internet website and the school's publicly
- 29 <u>accessible Internet website</u>, if applicable.
- 30 (c) A school may be subject to an annual audit by the

- 1 department, its local school board or the Auditor General, in
- 2 <u>addition to any other audits required by Federal law or this</u>
- 3 act. Schools located within a school district of the first class
- 4 may be subject to an annual audit by the controller of the city
- 5 of the first class.
- 6 (d) A school shall annually provide a copy of its annual
- 7 budget for the operation of the school that identifies the
- 8 following:
- 9 <u>(1) The source of funding for all expenditures.</u>
- 10 (2) Where funding is provided by a school foundation,
- 11 <u>including any educational management service providers, the</u>
- 12 amount of funds and a description of the use of the funds.
- 13 (3) The salaries of all administrators of the school.
- 14 (e) Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the school
- 15 and an affiliated school foundation and any educational
- 16 management service providers of the school shall make copies of
- 17 its annual Federal and State tax filings available upon request
- 18 and on the school's, school foundation's or educational
- 19 management service provider's publicly accessible Internet
- 20 website, including Internal Revenue Service Code Form 990,
- 21 Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax and all related
- 22 schedules and appendices. The school foundation and any
- 23 educational management service providers of the school shall
- 24 also make copies of its annual budget available upon request and
- 25 on the school foundation's or educational management service
- 26 provider's publicly accessible Internet website within thirty
- 27 (30) days of the close of the foundation's or educational
- 28 management service provider's fiscal year. The annual budget
- 29 <u>must include the salaries of all employes of the school</u>
- 30 foundation or of the educational management service providers of

- 1 the school.
- 2 (f) A school entity shall not make a payment to an
- 3 educational management service provider that exceeds five (5)
- 4 per centum of its per pupil cost.
- 5 (q) All operations of an educational management service
- 6 provider for a school pursuant to a contract or agreement with
- 7 the school shall be subject to public audit requirements under
- 8 section 2553. In addition, funds provided by a school to an
- 9 <u>educational management service provider for a school pursuant to</u>
- 10 <u>a contract or agreement with the school and the use of the funds</u>
- 11 by an educational management service provider shall be subject
- 12 to the audit provisions of section 403 of the act of April 9,
- 13 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as "The Fiscal Code."
- 14 (h) The school records produced, obtained or maintained by
- 15 <u>an educational management service provider for a school pursuant</u>
- 16 to a contract or agreement with the school shall be subject to
- 17 disclosure under the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3),
- 18 known as the "Right-to-Know Law."
- 19 (i) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 20 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 21 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 22 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 23 Commonwealth.
- 24 "Educational management service provider." A for-profit
- 25 education management organization, nonprofit charter management
- 26 organization, school design provider, business manager or any
- 27 other partner entity with which a school entity intends to
- 28 contract or presently contracts to provide educational services,
- 29 <u>operational services or management services to the school</u>
- 30 entity.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
