1 2 3	Amending Title 53 (Municipalities Generally) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in municipal authorities, further providing for money of authority.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Section 5612(b) of the Title 53 of the
7	Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
8	§ 5612. Money of authority.
9	* * *
10	(b) Report <u>A required annual report shall be published in</u>
11	accordance with the following:
12	(1) Every authority whose fiscal year ends December 31
13	shall file on or before July 1 an annual report of its fiscal
14	affairs covering the preceding calendar year with the
15	Department of Community and Economic Development and with the
16	municipality creating the authority on forms prepared and
17	distributed by the Department of Community and Economic
18	Development. Authorities whose fiscal year does not end on

December 31 shall file the report within 90 days after the
 end of their fiscal year.

3 (2) Every authority shall have its books, accounts and 4 records audited annually by a certified public accountant, 5 and a copy of his audit report shall be filed in the same 6 manner and within the same time period as the annual report. 7 The audit shall comply with the following standards:

8 <u>(i) The generally accepted government auditing</u> 9 <u>standards, including the standards published by the</u> 10 <u>General Accountability Office.</u>

 (ii) The Single Audit Act of 1984 (31 U.S.C. § 7501

<u>(iii) 2 C.F.R. Pt. 200 (relating to the Uniform</u>
 administrative requirements, cost principles and audit
 requirements for Federal awards).

16 (iv) Any other Federal or State requirements for an 17 <u>audit.</u>

18 (3) A concise financial statement shall be published 19 annually at least once in a newspaper of general circulation 20 in the municipality where the principal office of the 21 authority is located. If the publication is not made by the 22 authority, the municipality shall publish such statement at 23 the expense of the authority.

24 (4) If the authority fails to make such an audit or if 25 the municipality determines that there is a need for an 26 audit, then the controller, auditor or accountant designated 27 by the municipality is hereby authorized and empowered from 28 time to time to examine at the expense of the authority the 29 accounts and books of it, including its receipts,

30 disbursements, contracts, leases, sinking funds, investments

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1	and any other matters relating to its finances, operation and
2	affairs. In the course of performing an audit under this
3	subsection the municipality may request the assistance of the
4	<u>Auditor General.</u>

6	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
