AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 1 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in matters affecting 2 government units, further providing for exceptions to 3 sovereign immunity and for limitations on damages. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Section 8522(b) of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 8 9 § 8522. Exceptions to sovereign immunity. * * * 10 (b) Acts which may impose liability. -- The following acts by 11 12 a Commonwealth party may result in the imposition of liability on the Commonwealth and the defense of sovereign immunity shall 13 14 not be raised to claims for damages caused by: * * * 15 (11) Wrongful imprisonment. -- Damages under this 16 17 paragraph shall not exceed the following: (i) a sum equal to twice the amount of the gross 18

- 1 wages of the plaintiff earned in the year prior to the
- 2 plaintiff's arrest or \$25,000, whichever is greater, for
- 4 <u>(ii) reasonable attorney fees and court costs</u>
- 5 <u>incurred by the plaintiff as a result of the wrongful</u>
- 6 <u>conviction; and</u>
- 7 <u>(iii) restitution of all fines, surcharges and</u>
- 8 <u>penalties incurred by the plaintiff as a result of the</u>
- 9 <u>wrongful conviction.</u>
- 10 Section 2. Section 8528(d) of Title 42 is amended to read:
- 11 § 8528. Limitations on damages.
- 12 * * *
- 13 (d) Exclusions. -- This section shall not apply to damages
- 14 awarded under section 8522(b)(10) or (11).
- 15 Section 3. The amendment or addition of 42 Pa.C.S. §§
- 16 8522(b)(11) and 8528(d) shall apply to any person found to have
- 17 been wrongfully imprisoned under 42 Pa.C.S. Ch. 95 Subch. B.
- 18 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
