10	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
11	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a

13	Section 1507. In-person Instruction or Tuition Grant Program
14	Required(a) Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of
15	this section, a school district that does not provide full-time
16	<u>in-person instruction or denies a resident student full-time in-</u>
17	person instruction in the district must establish a tuition
18	grant program under section 2012-B.
19	(b) The amount of the tuition grant may be no less than the
20	maximum amount allowed under section 2012-B(b).

1	(C)	Any	resident	student	shall	be	eliqible	for	а	tuition

- 3 (d) A resident student receiving a tuition grant under this

4 section shall continue to be eligible if the student remains a

5 resident student of the school district, regardless of whether

- 6 the school district reestablishes in-person instruction.
- 7 (e) The school district shall use funds received from the
- 8 <u>Commonwealth for educational purposes to establish tuition</u>
- 9 grants under this section to provide for the education of
- 10 students who reside within the boundaries of the school district
- 11 and who attend a school entity providing all in-person
- 12 <u>instruction</u>.
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
