AN ACT

Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled "An act relating to the finances of the State government; providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for 3 ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint 4 Underwriting Association, for entertainment business 5 financial management firms, for private dam financial 6 assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for 7 the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes, 8 bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the 9 10 collection and recovery of fees and other money or property due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 11 including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale, 12 the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds 13 and securities belonging to or in the possession of the 14 15 Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the 16 courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and 17 18 all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting 19 moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 20 and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth, 21 authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes 22 23 to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of 24 Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of 25 certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every 26 27 department, board, commission, and officer of the State government, every political subdivision of the State, and 28 29 certain officers of such subdivisions, every person, association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or 30 31 collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws 32 imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 33 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the 34

- 1 Commonwealth," in emergency COVID-19 response, providing for
- 2 Federal maintenance of effort restrictions and for ending
- maintenance of effort restrictions related to COVID-19 public
- 4 health emergency.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known
- 8 as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding sections to read:
- 9 Section 164-C. Federal maintenance of effort restrictions.
- 10 (a) Procedures. -- When the department receives funding
- 11 contingent on temporary maintenance of effort restrictions or,
- 12 for any reason, is limited in the ability to disenroll
- 13 <u>individuals</u>, such as through restrictions imposed by section
- 14 6008 of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (Public Law
- 15 <u>116-127</u>, <u>134 Stat. 177</u>), the department shall:
- (1) Continue to conduct redeterminations as in the
- normal course of business and act on the redeterminations to
- 18 <u>the fullest extent permissible under the law.</u>
- 19 (2) Within 60 days of the expiration of the
- 20 restrictions, complete a full audit in which the department
- 21 shall:
- (i) Complete and act on eligibility redeterminations
- for all cases that have not had a redetermination within
- the last 12 months.
- 25 (ii) Request Federal approval from the Centers for
- 26 <u>Medicare and Medicaid Services for the authority to</u>
- 27 conduct and act on eligibility redeterminations for each
- 28 individual enrolled during the period of restrictions
- 29 <u>enrolled for three or more total months and shall, within</u>
- 30 <u>60 days of approval, conduct and act on the</u>
- 31 redeterminations.
- 32 (iii) Carry out an additional check of all

| 4 | (iv) Submit a summary report of the audit to the |
| 5 | members of the General Assembly, the Office of Inspector |
| 6 | General, the Attorney General, the Auditor General and |
| 7 | the State Treasurer. At a minimum, the report shall |
| 8 | <u>include:</u> |
| 9 | (A) The number of enrollees enrolled in medical |
| 10 | assistance who are ineligible at the time that the |
| 11 | restrictions end, how confident the department is in |
| 12 | that number and on what basis that confidence is |
| 13 | <u>founded.</u> |
| 14 | (B) The extent to which the department has |
| 15 | continued to conduct redeterminations while |
| 16 | restrictions were in place and how much time the |
| 17 | department expects to need to disenroll all |
| 18 | ineligible individuals. |
| 19 | (C) The total State dollars spent on ineligible |
| 20 | enrollees in each month in the period in which the |
| 21 | restrictions were in place and the basis for that |
| 22 | estimate. |
| 23 | (D) For each month in the period in which the |
| 24 | restrictions were in place, the number of individuals |
| 25 | checked for eligibility by cross-checking |
| 26 | incarceration records, the number of these |
| 27 | individuals determined ineligible and the number of |
| 28 | individuals removed within one month on this basis. |
| 29 | (E) For each month in the period in which the |
| 3.0 | restrictions were in place, the number of individuals |

| 11 | (G) For each month in the period in which the |
| 12 | restrictions were in place, the number of individuals |
| 13 | checked for eligibility by cross-checking death |
| 14 | records, the number of these individuals determined |
| 15 | ineligible and the number of individuals removed |
| 16 | within one month on this basis. |
| 17 | (H) For each month in the period in which the |
| 18 | restrictions were in place, the number of individuals |
| 19 | checked for eligibility by cross-checking lottery |
| 20 | records, the number of these individuals determined |
| 21 | ineligible and the number of individuals removed |
| 22 | within one month on this basis. |
| 23 | (I) For each month in the period in which the |
| 24 | restrictions were in place, the number of individuals |
| 25 | checked for eligibility by cross-checking wage |
| 26 | records, the number of these individuals determined |
| 27 | ineligible and the number of individuals removed |
| 28 | within one month on this basis. |
| 29 | (J) The percentage of enrollees in each |
| 30 | eligibility category found to have zero reported and |

- 2 <u>which the restrictions were in place.</u>
- 3 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 4 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this

- 6 "Department." The Department of Human Services of the
- 7 Commonwealth.
- 8 <u>Section 165-C. Ending maintenance of effort restrictions</u>
- 9 <u>related to COVID-19 public health emergency.</u>
- 10 (a) Redeterminations. -- Notwithstanding section 6008 of the
- 11 Families First Coronavirus Response Act (Public Law 116-127, 134
- 12 Stat. 177), the department shall notify the Centers for Medicare
- 13 and Medicaid Services that the State will proceed with
- 14 scheduled, annual redeterminations and remove enrollees who are
- 15 ineligible beginning on the first day of the first full quarter
- 16 after the effective date of this section.
- 17 (b) Prioritization. -- The department shall prioritize the
- 18 redetermination of enrollees who the department has designated
- 19 as the maintained population and shall immediately perform a
- 20 redetermination on the maintained population.
- 21 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 22 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 23 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 24 "Department." The Department of Human Services of the
- 25 Commonwealth.
- 26 "Maintained population." Enrollees who would have been
- 27 ineligible or did not return a renewal of their Medicaid
- 28 coverage maintained between March 2020 and March 2023 under the
- 29 <u>continuous coverage requirement.</u>
- 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
