11	(b) RegulationsThe commissioner, after consultation with
12	the licensing boards and commissions, shall have the power to
13	promulgate regulations specifying the procedural rules to be
14	followed by hearing examiners in the conduct of hearings in
15	disciplinary matters before a licensing board or licensing
16	commission. All proceedings shall <u>comply with all of the</u>
17	following:
18	(1) Proceedings shall be conducted in accordance with

1	the provisions of 2 Pa.C.S. (relating to administrative law
2	and procedure).
3	(2) The respondent shall appear in person for a hearing
4	conducted under this act.
5	(3) An individual or entity, or an entity's
6	representative, adversely affected by the respondent's
7	actions which are relevant to the disciplinary matter pending
8	before the licensing board or commission or a hearing
9	examiner shall:
10	(i) have an opportunity to provide testimony at a
11	hearing concerning any loss, damages or injury suffered
12	as a direct result of the respondent's actions; or
13	(ii) have an opportunity to provide a written
14	statement concerning any loss, damages or injury suffered
15	as a direct result of the respondent's actions.
16	(4) Any written statement submitted pursuant to
17	paragraph (3) shall be presented to the hearing examiner.
18	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
