8 (D) Attainment of an industry-recognized credential[, as 9 identified in the industry credential resource book or in the 10 industry-based learning guidelines compiled by the department]. 11 * * *

16 (d) As used in this section, the following words and phrases 17 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless 18 the context clearly indicates otherwise:

19 "Accredited four-year nonprofit institution of higher 20 education." Any of the following:

(1) A university within the State System of Higher Educationunder Article XX-A.

23 (2) A State-related institution as defined in section 1502-24 A.

(3) Any accredited nonprofit public, private or independent
 college or university that confers four-year baccalaureate
 degrees.

28 "Accredited nonprofit institution of higher education." Any 29 of the following:

30 (1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A.

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(2) An accredited four-year nonprofit institution of higher
 education.

3 (3) Any accredited nonprofit public, private or independent4 college or university.

5 (4) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.

6 "ACT." A standardized test for the assessment of college7 readiness administered by ACT.

8 "ACT WorkKeys assessment." An assessment of workplace skills9 administered by ACT.

10 "Advanced Placement Program." A program authorized by the 11 college board that allows a student to study college-level 12 subjects while enrolled in high school and to receive advanced 13 placement and college credit for earning a qualified score on 14 the course-related Advanced Placement exam.

15 "Approved alternative assessment." A SAT, PSAT, ACT or Armed16 Services Vocational Aptitude Battery test.

17 "Approved industry-based competency assessment." A NOCTI 18 exam, NIMS assessment or other industry-based competency 19 assessment identified by the Secretary of Education and approved 20 by the State Board of Education or identified by an act of the 21 General Assembly.

22 "Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery Test." The 23 aptitude test developed and maintained by the United States 24 Department of Defense.

25 "Chief school administrator." The superintendent of a school 26 district, executive director of an intermediate unit, 27 administrative director of an area vocational-technical school 28 or chief executive officer of a charter school, cyber charter 29 school, regional charter school or multiple charter school 30 organization.

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1 "Concurrent enrollment course." A course in which a
2 secondary student is enrolled and, upon successful completion of
3 which both high school and postsecondary credit are earned.

4 "Cooperative education program." A program of instruction
5 whereby students alternate or coordinate their high school
6 studies with a job in a field related to their academic or
7 career objectives.

8 "CTE Concentrator." A student <u>under Article XVIII</u> who, by 9 the end of a reporting year, will be reported as successfully 10 completing at least fifty percent (50%) of the minimum technical 11 instructional hours required under 22 Pa. Code Ch. 339 (relating 12 to vocational education).

13 "Department." The Department of Education of the 14 Commonwealth.

15 "Established score." A score recommended by the secretary 16 and approved by the State Board of Education.

17 "GPA." Grade point average.

18 <u>"Industry-recognized credential." A credential identified in</u>

19 the industry credential resource book or in the industry-based

20 <u>learning guidelines compiled by the department.</u>

International Baccalaureate Diploma Program." An academically challenging two-year precollege diploma program comprised of three core requirements and six academic subject areas with final examinations that prepare students sixteen (16) to nineteen (19) years of age for higher education and life in a global society.

27 "NIMS assessment." An assessment based on the National28 Institute for Metalworking Skills standards.

29 "NOCTI exam." A National Occupational Competency Testing30 Institute exam.

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"Postsecondary course." A course in which a secondary
 student is enrolled and, upon successful completion,
 postsecondary credit is earned.

4 "Preapprenticeship program." An apprenticeship program
5 registered with the Pennsylvania Apprenticeship and Training
6 Council.

7 "SAT." A standardized test for the assessment of college 8 readiness administered by the College Board.

9 "SAT Subject Test." A standardized test for the assessment
10 of a specific content area administered by the College Board.
11 "School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area
12 vocational-technical school, charter school, cyber charter
13 school, regional charter school or multiple charter school
14 organization.

15 "Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
